The number of Crime Index offenses reported to law enforcement agencies throughout the United States decreased 0.3 percent during the first six months of 2001 when compared to the figures reported during the same period of 2000. The violent crime category, which includes murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault, declined 1.3 percent. Property crimes, consisting of the offenses of burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft, declined 0.2 percent.

The Crime Index trends illustrated in Tables 1 and 2 reflect the percent change in offenses known to law enforcement for January to June of the year 2001 as compared to those for the same time period in 2000. The Crime Index trends illustrated in Table 3 reflect the percent change in offenses known to law enforcement for the first six months of the years indicated. Table 4 presents a two-year comparison of offenses known to law enforcement for cities 100,000 and more in population for January to June of the years 2000 and 2001.

Figures used in this report are submitted voluntarily by law enforcement agencies throughout the country. Individuals using these tabulations are cautioned against drawing conclusions by making direct comparisons between cities due to the many factors which affect the amount and type of crime from place to place. Some of these factors are listed in the annual *Crime in the United States*. More valid use can be made of these figures by determining deviations from national averages and through comparisons with averages for cities in similar population groups (Table 1). It is important to remember that crime is a social problem and, therefore, a concern of the entire community. The efforts of law enforcement are limited to factors within its control. Data users can obtain assistance by calling 304-625-4995.

Data users are cautioned against comparisons of crime trends presented in this report and those estimated by the National Crime Victimization Survey (NCVS), administered by the Bureau of Justice Statistics. Because of differences in methodology and crime coverage, the two programs examine the Nation's crime problem from somewhat different perspectives, and their results are not strictly comparable. The definitional and procedural differences can account for many of the apparent discrepancies in results from the two programs.
