Subject: Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for Construction of a Fish Barrier in Hot Springs Canyon (Action by December 7, 2008)

The Bureau of Reclamation and the Bureau of Land Management have issued the attached draft EA to solicit public comments on the potential environmental effects of a proposed fish barrier in Hot Springs Canyon within the Hot Springs Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC). The Hot Springs ACEC is part of the 57,500-acre Muleshoe Ranch Cooperative Management Area located in Cochise County, Arizona. The proposed fish barrier is intended to prevent the upstream invasion of nonnative fishes into portions of Hot Springs Canyon occupied by threatened and endangered fish species.
