A BILL

3 SECTION 1. ACROSS-THE-BOARD RESCISSIONS IN NON-DE-

- 4 FENSE, NON-HOMELAND-SECURITY DISCRE-5 TIONARY SPENDING FOR FISCAL YEAR 2009.
- 6 (a) ACROSS-THE-BOARD RESCISSIONS.—There is
- 7 hereby rescinded an amount equal to 5 percent of—

(1) the budget authority provided (or obligation
 limitation imposed) for fiscal year 2009 for any non defense, non-homeland-security discretionary account
 in any fiscal year 2009 appropriation Act;
 (2) the budget authority provided in any ad-

6 vance appropriation for fiscal year 2009 for any
7 non-defense, non-homeland-security discretionary ac8 count in any prior fiscal year appropriation Act; and
9 (3) the contract authority provided in fiscal
10 year 2009 for any program that is subject to a limi11 tation contained in any fiscal year 2009 appropria12 tion Act for any non-defense, non-homeland-security

13 discretionary account.

(b) NON-DEFENSE, NON-HOMELAND-SECURITY DIS15 CRETIONARY ACCOUNT.—For purposes of subsection (a),
16 the term "non-defense, non-homeland security discre17 tionary account" means any discretionary account, other
18 than—

19 (1) any account included in a Department of20 Defense Appropriations Act;

21 (2) any account included in a Department of
22 Homeland Security Appropriations Act;

(3) any account of the Department of Defense
included in a Military Construction and Veterans Affairs and Related Agencies Appropriations Act; or

(4) any account for Department of Energy de fense activities included in an Energy and Water
 Development and Related Agencies Appropriations
 Act.

5 (c) PROPORTIONATE APPLICATION.—Any rescission
6 made by subsection (a) shall be applied proportionately—

7 (1) to each discretionary account and each item
8 of budget authority described in such subsection;
9 and

10 (2) within each such account and item, to each 11 program, project, and activity (with programs, 12 projects, and activities as delineated in the appro-13 priation Act or accompanying reports for the rel-14 evant fiscal year covering such account or item, or 15 for accounts and items not included in appropriation 16 Acts, as delineated in the most recently submitted 17 President's budget).

(d) SUBSEQUENT APPROPRIATION LAWS.—In the
case of any fiscal year 2009 appropriation Act enacted
after the enactment of this section, any rescission required
by subsection (a) shall take effect immediately after the
enactment of such Act.

(e) OMB REPORT.—Within 30 days after the enactment of this section (or, if later, 30 days after the enactment of any fiscal year 2009 appropriation Act), the Di-

rector of the Office of Management and Budget shall sub mit to the Committees on Appropriations of the House
 of Representatives and the Senate a report specifying the
 account and amount of each rescission made pursuant to
 subsection (a).
