Consent for Release of Personal Records by Executive Agencies

The Privacy Act of 1974, P.L. 93-579, became fully effective on September 27, 1975. The purpose of the Privacy Act is to control the federal government's collection and dissemination of personal information about individual citizens. The Privacy Act authorizes the disclosure of records to congressional offices acting on behalf of constituents only when the individual has consented.
