If you want to switch your **Medicare** prescription drug plan, you must do so between **Nov. 15** and **Dec. 31**


As a health care professional, I encourage every senior in Arkansas to review their prescription coverage every year.

If you have a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan

If you are one of the millions of seniors who has signed up for a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan, now is your opportunity to review your current plan and see if it is still the best option for you.

Medicare recipients can switch their Prescription Drug Plans from *November 15* to *December 31*. If you do not switch by the end of the year, you will have to wait until November 2008 to switch plans.

Millions of seniors have already taken advantage and have cut their out-of-pocket costs for their medicines.

Because plans change every year, you could now save even more with a different plan.

November 15 to December 31 is the only window when you may switch plans.

Congressman John Boozman wants every Arkansas senior to have the opportunity to choose the drug plan which best fits their unique situation.

If you haven't signed up for a plan

If you have not already signed up for a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan, you can join three months before you turn 65 to three months after you turn 65 (called your Initial Enrollment Period).

Congressman Boozman encourages you to consider joining one during your initial enrollment period if a Medicare Drug Plan is best for your situation. If you wait to join later, your plan may cost more.

If you are already covered by a plan by your employers, you should talk to your primary healthcare provider to see if a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan is best for your unique situation.

December 31 is the deadline to change your **Medicare** Prescription Drug Plan

Congressman John Boozman encourages every Arkansas senior currently enrolled in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan to review their plan to see if it is still the best for them.

Medicare recipients can switch their Drug Plans from **Nov. 15** to **Dec. 31**. If you do not want to switch plans, you do not need to do anything to continue the coverage you currently have.
