**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1078**  
**OFFERED BY MR. MARKEY**

Strike section 2 of the bill (and redesignate succeeding sections accordingly).

Page 5, beginning on line 7, strike “; SOCIAL SECURITY ACCOUNT NUMBER”.

Page 5, line 8, strike “The terms” and all that follows through “given those terms” and insert the following: “The term ‘Social Security number’ means the social security account number assigned to an individual under section 205(c)(2)(B) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 405(c)(2)(B))”.

Page 5, beginning on line 22, strike “or Social Security account number”.

Page 6, beginning on line 7, strike “and Social Security account numbers”.

Page 6, beginning on line 10, strike “and Social Security account numbers”.

Page 6, beginning on line 15, strike “and Social Security account numbers”.

Page 6, beginning on line 19, strike “and Social Security account numbers”.

Page 7, beginning on line 8, strike “and Social Security account numbers”.

Page 7, beginning on line 21, strike “or Social Security account numbers”.

Page 8, line 13, strike “or Social Security account number”.

Page 8, line 14, strike “and” and insert the following:

1           (F) to the extent necessary for legitimate  
2           consumer credit verification, if the Social Security  
3           numbers used for such verification are redacted in accordance with uniform redaction  
4           standards established by the Commission in  
5           such regulations; and

Page 8, line 15, strike “(F)” and insert “(G)”.

Page 8, line 17, strike “the findings in section 2 and”.

Page 9, line 12, strike “ADMINISTRATION AND APPLICABILITY” and insert “ENFORCEMENT”.

Page 10, beginning on line 20, strike “damages, restitution, or other compensation on behalf of residents of the State” and insert “civil penalties in an amount of \$11,000 per violation not to exceed a total of \$5,000,000”.

At the end of the bill, insert the following:

**1 SEC. 4. EFFECT ON OTHER LAWS.**

2 This Act supersedes any provision of a statute, regu-  
3 lation, or rule of a State or political subdivision of a State  
4 that expressly restricts or prohibits the sale or purchase  
5 of Social Security numbers in a manner consistent with  
6 the regulations promulgated under section 3(b).
