REPORT OF THE AUDIT DIVISION ON THE FRIENDS OF TIM JOHNSON

I. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

A. AUDIT AUTHORITY

This report is based on an audit of Friends of Tim Johnson (FOTJ), undertaken by the Audit Division of the Federal Election Commission (the Commission) in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the Act). The audit was conducted pursuant to Section 438(b) of Title 2 of the United States Code that states, in part, that the Commission may conduct audits and field investigations of any political committee required to file a report under Section 434 of this title. Prior to conducting any audit under this subsection, the Commission shall perform an internal review of reports filed by selected committees to determine if the reports filed by a particular committee meet the threshold requirements for substantial compliance with the Act.

B. AUDIT COVERAGE

The audit covered the period from October 14, 1999 (the date of FOTJ's initial deposit) through December 31, 2000. FOTJ reported a beginning cash balance of \$-0-; total receipts of \$1,338,024; total disbursements of \$1,311,887; and a closing cash balance of \$26,137.

C. COMMITTEE ORGANIZATION

FOTJ registered with the Commission on November 9, 1999 as the principal campaign committee for Timothy Johnson, Republican candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from the state of Illinois, Fifteenth District, for the 2000 election. FOTJ maintains its headquarters in Champaign, Il and its treasurer is Mr. James Bray.

To manage its financial activity, FOTJ maintained one bank account. From this account, approximately 800 disbursements were made, totaling approximately \$1,307,486. FOTJ's receipts were comprised of approximately 2,860 contributions from individuals, totaling \$585,782; 270 contributions from political committees, totaling approximately \$405,157; and, three loans from the candidate in the amount of \$340,000. Accounting and recordkeeping functions were performed by campaign staff, which utilized commonly available campaign management software.

D. AUDIT SCOPE AND PROCEDURES

Following Commission-approved procedures, the Audit staff evaluated various risk factors and as a result, the scope of this audit was limited to the following general categories:

- 1. The receipt of contributions or loans in excess of the statutory limitations:
- 2. the receipt of contributions from prohibited sources, such as those from corporations or labor organizations;
- 3. proper disclosure of contributions from individuals, political committees and other entities, to include the itemization of contributions when required, as well as, the completeness and accuracy of the information disclosed;
- 4. the accuracy of total reported receipts, disbursements and cash balances as compared to bank records:
- 5. adequate recordkeeping for receipts transactions; and,
- 6. other audit procedures that were deemed necessary in the situation.

As part of the Commission's standard audit process, an inventory of FOTJ's records was conducted prior to the audit fieldwork to determine if its records were materially complete and in an auditable state. Based on our review of the records presented, it was concluded that they were materially complete and fieldwork began immediately.

Based upon our examination of the reports and statements filed, and the records presented by FOTJ, no material non-compliance was discovered.
