

# 2008 Camping Season

## Six Rivers National Forest



**S**ix Rivers National Forest offers nearly one million acres for your enjoyment, relaxation, and exploration. Within a six hour drive from the Bay Area, you can experience the solitude of the wilderness or enjoy camping near others in developed campgrounds. Camp in densely forested woodlands or open meadows, discover secluded flats along river banks and enjoy panoramic views of majestic mountains.

**Campground Information:** Developed campgrounds are equipped with vault or flush toilets, fire rings and/or stoves, tables, parking for two vehicles, and drinking water (unless otherwise noted). Electrical hookups are not provided; showers are available at Panther Flat Campground. Reservations can be made for eight campgrounds by calling toll-free (877) 444-6777 or (877) 833-6777 (TDD); approximately 2/3 of these sites are on the reservation system. Other sites and campgrounds are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. There is a 14-day limit for occupying a campground, and pets on leashes are permitted.

**Campground Fees:** Campground fees vary depending on the services provided. Family campsites accommodate up to five people per site, with a maximum of two vehicles. There is a \$5/night fee charged for a second vehicle. A vehicle is a motor-home towing another vehicle, a pickup with a camper towing a vehicle, a single car or motorcycle, or a vehicle towing a trailer. If you would like to picnic in a campsite for part of the day, you must pay the posted day use fee. There is no charge for pets.

**Campground Hosts:** Most campgrounds are

staffed by volunteer hosts who provide a warm welcome and information to campers. Hosts also assist by reporting resource damage, disturbances, and needed maintenance repairs. Please contact them if you need assistance. If you are interested in serving as a campground host, please contact one of our offices.

**Rustic Camping:** If you prefer undeveloped camping areas, most of the forest is open for camping unless specifically prohibited. Dispersed camping is free of charge and is limited to 30 days per year. Your site must be at least 1/4 mile from developed sites. A campfire permit is required for all use of any fires, gas lanterns, barbecues, and camp stoves outside the developed campgrounds. Permits are free and available at all Forest Service offices.

**Interagency Senior Pass :** Persons 62 years or older are eligible for this pass which entitles the holder to a 50 percent discount on camping fees; it is also a lifetime entrance pass to federal recreation areas. The Interagency Senior Pass is available to U.S. citizens or permanent residents who are age 62 or older. There is a \$10 fee for the lifetime Interagency Senior Pass

**Interagency Access Pass:** If you are medically designated as either disabled or blind, this free pass entitles you to 50 percent off camping fees and free admittance to federal recreation areas. The Interagency Access Pass is available to U.S. citizens or permanent residents who have a permanent disability.

You may obtain your Senior or Access Pass in person at any available national forest or grassland offices. They are not available by mail or phone.
