Box 419205 Kansas City, Missouri 64141-6205 On May 16, 2008, the Secretary of Agriculture authorized the release of wheat from the BEHT for use under Public Law 480, Title II. Accordingly, the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) plans to sell approximately 500,000 metric tons (18.37 million bushels) of wheat from the BEHT.

CCC is making all classes of CCC-owned wheat stocks available for sale. CCC-owned wheat inventory information such as class, storage rate, and loadout rates may be obtained from CCC's catalog listing, which is attached to this invitation.

Offers to purchase CCC-owned wheat must be received in the Kansas City Commodity Office (KCCO) by 2:30 p.m., CDT, May 22, 2008. Offers must be made on Offer Form Exhibit A, basis flat price per bushel, and sent via facsimile to Commodities Management Division (CMD) at (816) 926-6381 or (816) 926-6767. Official time of receipt will be determined by KCCO communication equipment.

Offers must be made on a lot by lot basis and cannot be contingent on the acceptance of another lot. Lots must be bid in their entirety. CCC reserves the right to reject any or all offers. CCC will telephone the contractor with notice of acceptance by 9:15 a.m., CDT, May 23, 2008. Public release of award information will be no later than May 27, 2008.

The wheat will be received by the contractor instore, at the storage locations specified in the catalog listing. Prior to submitting an offer, interested parties are:

- Advised to check with the storing warehouse operator regarding the terms and conditions applicable for delivery, and
- Encouraged to work with the storing warehouse operator to establish premium and discount schedules in cases of quality or location discrepancies.

Any differences in quantity and quality of CCC-owned wheat received by the contractor are to be settled between the storing warehouse operator and the contractor. CCC will not facilitate this settlement.

Payment Terms: Contractor to remit to CCC 100 percent of contract value (based on the net quantity on each warehouse receipt) by wire transfer or check, within 5 business days after the date of the contract. If payment is not received within the specified timeframe, interest at the rate of 7.0 percent per annum shall be paid by the contractor to CCC from the first calendar day after the date of the contract through the date payment is received by CCC.

The buyer must remit payment to CCC by wire transfer within five business days after the date of the contract to:

CCC will pay storage through the date of the transfer of title but no later than five business days after the date of sale. Storing warehouse operators are obligated to maintain the CCC storage and loadout rates after CCC transfers title in accordance with Part 2 of the Uniform Grain and Rice Storage Agreement (UGRSA).

The contractor is responsible for paying loadout charges, plus any storage charges incurred after CCC transfers title to the wheat instore. The storage and handling rates contained in the CCC Schedule of Rates will apply to the wheat until loaded out, provided the transferee, in writing, orders the wheat loaded out for immediate shipment within 30 days after the date title is transferred. If the transferee does not request, in writing, loadout within 30 days after the date title is transferred, the storage and handling rates applicable to the transferee for the wheat shall not exceed CCC's Schedule of Rates in effect at the time of title transfer until the earlier of: 1) 60 days, or 2) title to the wheat is transferred by the transferee to another party, or 3) the transferee loads the wheat out of the warehouse.

Default and Determination – If for any reason the contractor does not perform any portion of the contract terms, CCC shall have the right to terminate in whole or any part of the contract. In the event CCC terminates the contract in whole or in part, CCC may offer the commodity for sale and the contractor shall be liable to CCC for any loss from the original sale.
