Arrest Trends, Suburban Areas, by Sex, 2006-2007

- In the Nation's suburban areas, the number of males arrested decreased
 1.1 percent in 2007 when compared with the 2006 data; the number of males under age 18 arrested decreased 2.9 percent.
- From 2006 to 2007, the number of females arrested in suburban areas increased 1.5 percent, but the number of females under age 18 arrested declined 0.2 percent.
- For violent crime, the number of males arrested decreased 2.2 percent, and the number of females arrested for this offense increased 2.2 percent.
- In the Nation's suburban areas, the number of males arrested for property crime increased 1.5 percent; the number of females arrested for property crime increased 11.6 percent.
- The number of males arrested for motor vehicle theft decreased 13.7 percent in suburban areas, and the number of females arrested for this offense decreased 12.4 percent.
- The number of juveniles (persons under age 18) arrested for motor vehicle theft
 also declined for both genders in 2007. The number of male juveniles arrested
 for motor vehicle theft decreased 14.1 percent when compared with the 2006 data,
 and the number of female juveniles arrested for this offense decreased 12.2
 percent.
