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- Recommend and develop FDA policies and programs for emergency and crisis management
- Coordinate FDA's emergency response activities
 - Intra-agency coordination: FDA headquarters and field scientific, regulatory, investigational and laboratory components
 - Inter-agency coordination: CDC, USDA, State and local food, agriculture and health agencies

- Coordinate Agency evaluation of foodborne illness outbreaks to determine appropriate internal and external referral for action
- Operate 24-hour response, seven-day-a-week emergency response system
- Operate FDA's Emergency Operations Center (EOC)


- Manage FDA's Emergency Operations Network Incident Management System (EON IMS)
 - Web-based tool for storing, managing and accessing large volumes of information related to incidents
- Manage FDA's National Consumer Complaint System

- Lead Agency lessons learned process after major incidents
- Create and exercise FDA Emergency Response Plans
- Coordinate and participate in internal and external emergency exercises

Emergency Operations Network Incident Management (EON IMS): A Knowledge Management Tool

- Captures information about incidents involving FDA regulated products
- Generates maps
- Creates record of related information
- Serves as data mart for related literature
- Provides situational awareness to Agency officials



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FDA and CDC work together to

- notify State and local officials of potential or confirmed outbreak
- utilize epidemiological data to determine severity, scope and association of outbreak with FDAregulated product
- determine what public health actions are needed to mitigate the outbreak including public notification and recall of product

- Canada/U.S./Mexico Trilateral Cooperation
 - Emergency, Preparedness and Response Working Group
 - Facilitate better international cooperation and response during incidents and more rapid and effective resolution of public health emergencies as a result of:
 - Improved readiness and knowledge
 - Enhanced emergency response capabilities because of information sharing and improved planning
 - Strengthened coordination among Trilateral emergency response officials
