 Vitamin B-1, or thiamine, along with other B vitamins, is primarily involved in energy production in the body, especially in the brain. Its principle use is to prevent deficiency (especially in diabetes, Crohn's disease, multiple sclerosis and other neurological diseases) and help maintain proper mental function, especially in the elderly. Severe thiamine deficiency is relatively uncommon -except in alcoholics- where a syndrome called, Wernicke-Korsakoff syndrome (a serious brain disorder) can result from the combination of alcohol intake and a thiamine deficiency. Mild deficiency usually results in fatigue and depression.
- (3) Name of the dietary ingredient if not provided in the text of the statement: Vitamin B-1 (thiamin hydrochloride)
- (4) Name of the dietary supplement: Vitamin B-1 100 mg
