On February 27, 2003, a final rule was published in the above matter amending the food additive regulations to provide for the safe use of Vitamin $\mathrm{D}_{3}$ as a nutrient supplement in calcium-fortified fruit juices and juice drinks (excluding fruit juices and juice drinks specially formulated or processed for infants). We request a technical amendment to the regulation as it is reproduced in the notice. The amendment would conform the regulation to reflect the actual approval.

Specifically, we note that new Section 172.380 (c) authorizes the use of Vitamin $D_{3}$ in juices "that are fortified with greater than $33 \%$ of the recommended daily intake (RDI) of calcium the reference amount customarily consumed RACC (RACC)." The use proposed in the Company's petition and found safe as noted in the preamble to the regulation pertained to products fortified with calcium in amounts "equal to" as well as greater than $33 \%$ of the RDI. The "equal to" language appears to have been inadvertently omitted. We request that the paragraph be revised to read "... that are fortified with equal to or greater than 33 percent ...."

With respect to Section 172.380 (d) and the authorization of the use of Vitamin $D_{3}$ in juice drinks, we request a comparable correction. Specifically, we ask that

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the last clause of the paragraph be revised to read "... that are fortified with equal to or greater than 10 percent ...."
