On April 27, 2000, the Grocery Manufacturers of America (GMA) submitted a Citizen Petition to request that the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) apply the First Amendment principles enunciated in <u>Pearson v. Shalala</u> to all food, not just to dietary supplements. The action announced by FDA on December 18, 2002¹ and the Guidance that is the subject of the notice published in the Federal Register on December 20, 2002² have now reversed the earlier FDA position on this matter and have granted the action requested in the GMA Citizen Petition. Accordingly, GMA is hereby withdrawing this Citizen Petition from further FDA consideration.
