Dear Ms. Armstrong:

This letter is in response to your citizen petition, dated January 19, 2001, requesting that the Food and Drug Administration require the declaration of the presence of methylcellulose and carrageenan in restaurant foods on the menus. You also requested that these additives be identified in foods by their names, "methylcellulose" and "carrageenan," rather than by terms such as "modified vegetable gum" or "carbohydrate gum."

In accordance with 21 CFR §10.30(e)(2), this letter is to advise you that we have not been able to reach a decision on your petition within the first 180 days of its receipt because of other Agency priorities and the limited availability of resources. We hope to be able to review your petition and respond to your request in the near future.
