Gentlemen\Ladies:

I understand that under present USDA regulations, "downed" animals are described as "diseased" and that it is illegal to sell their meat for human consumption.

However, the slaughterhouse killing of downers permits the flesh of ailing livestock to enter our food supply. These animals are not diagnosed before slaughter and we cannot know with certainty that they are not carrying some deadly disease vector. The recent incidence of a case of Mad Cow Disease in Canada brings this fact uncomfortably close to home.

A petition filed under docket number 98P-0151/CP1 addresses this violation of federal law. I urge you to act on this petition for the safety and health of the American public.
