In reviewing this report in conjunction is not considered warranted. with the proposed rules, the NTSB recommends that consideration be given at the December 4 public hearing to require emergency lighting for the forward accommodation and liferaft embarkation areas. In event of a fracture of the hull, and severing of the main electrical supply line, it is considered that emergency lighting is safe abandonment of the ship by the crew in the forward section of the vessel. The emergency power supply for the radiotelephone could be used for the emergency lighting requirement. Moreover, it seems more practical to provide this lighting at the time
