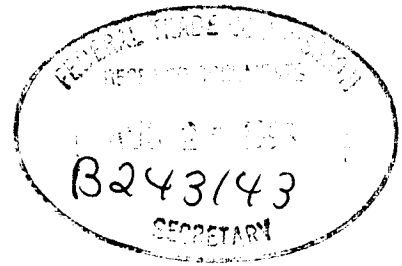

ORDER


Upon consideration of Respondent Intel Corporation's ("Intel") Motion to Compel Production of Documents pursuant to 16 C.F.R. § 3.38 and accompanying memoranda of law submitted by Intel and Complaint Counsel, and Intel's and Complaint Counsel's arguments to me on August 24, 1998,

IT IS ORDERED that, no later than one (1) business day after entry of this Order, Intel's outside counsel shall by facsimile serve a copy of this Order on Complaint Counsel and counsel for Digital Equipment Corporation ("Digital"), with copy to follow by first-class U.S. mail, postage prepaid.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Complaint Counsel will produce to Intel's outside counsel responsive material of Digital within the possession, custody, or control of Complaint Counsel unless, within five (5) business days of receipt of this Order, Digital has either negotiated a resolution to the production of such material to Intel's outside counsel, or filed an application in this Docket to withhold such disclosure, which application shall identify each document or class of documents sought to be so withheld and state with particularity the grounds for the demand that the document or class of documents shall be withheld.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within five (5) business days of receipt of an application to withhold such disclosure, a hearing will be held before the undersigned, if necessary, to determine whether there is just cause for withholding such materials from Intel's outside counsel.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, no later than six (6) business days after entry of this Order, Complaint Counsel shall commence production to Intel's outside counsel all Digital documents responsive to Intel's First and Third Requests for Production of Documents within the possession, custody, or control of Complaint Counsel, unless Digital has moved for a protective order or negotiated a resolution with Intel concerning production of Digital's responsive documents.
