American Motors Co.</u>, 805 F.2d 1323, 1328 (8th Cir. 1986), providing that a party can depose counsel for its opponent only upon a showing, inter alia, that no other means exist to obtain the information. At 1327. However, here the deposition is of counsel for a non-party and the <u>Shelton</u> rule is not applicable. <u>Nakash v. United States Department of Justice</u>, 128 F.R.D. 32, 35 (S.D.N.Y. 1989); <u>Williams v. City of Dallas</u>, 178 F.R.D. 103, 112 (N.D. Tex. 1998).
