**SUBJECT:** PROPOSED LICENSE AMENDMENT TO EXPORT NUCLEAR GRADE

GRAPHITE TO VARIOUS COUNTRIES FOR NON-NUCLEAR END USE

(XMAT0400/02)

#### **PURPOSE:**

To request Commission review of the proposed issuance of a license amendment to Poco Graphite involving the export of nuclear grade graphite. The application is being referred to the Commission in accordance with 10 CFR 110.40(b)(3).

#### DISCUSSION:

Poco Graphite produces a product which meets the definition of nuclear grade graphite in 10 CFR 110.2, having a boron equivalent content of less than 5 parts per million and density greater than 1.5 grams per cubic centimeter. Bulk shipments of such graphite are controlled by the United States and other members of the Nuclear Suppliers Group to help prevent its use as a moderator or reflector material in an unsafeguarded reactor.

On January 8, 2003, as revised on January 23, 2003, Poco Graphite applied for an amendment to replace existing license, XMAT0400/01, which expired on January 29, 2003 (Attachment 1). The amendment, XMAT0400/02, requests authority to: 1) increase the total amount of nuclear grade graphite for export from 750 short tons (680,385 kilograms) to 1,500 short tons (1,360,791 kilograms); 2) increase the maximum allowable individual shipment from 18,000 kilograms to 54,000 kilograms; 3) add Charmilles Diffusion, a manufacturer/distributor in Russia through the facility in France, as a party to the export; and 4) extend the expiration date to February 10, 2005. The graphite will be used by small businesses in various general non-nuclear commercial and industrial applications.

In response to NRC's request for its views under 10 CFR 110.41(b), the Executive Branch (EB), in a letter dated June 3, 2003 (Attachment 2), recommends that the license be issued to Poco Graphite, but limited to the quantities specified above and to the following destinations: member states of the European Union, Canada, Czech Republic, Japan, New Zealand, Romania, Singapore, Switzerland and Taiwan. This recommendation excludes Russia which has not provided the necessary assurances to the U.S. Government on retransfers to permit exports above the amount authorized by NRC's general license. However, the applicant, aware of the lack of Russian assurances and the limits of the general license, has decided to withdraw its request to add Russia to avoid delaying the issuance of the license authorizing exports to the other destinations (Attachment 3).

It is the EB's judgement that the proposed exports under the new license will not be inimical to the common defense and security of the United States and are consistent with the provisions of the Atomic Energy Act (AEA), as amended, if limited to the quantities and destinations specified above. The EB letter notes that, as parties to the Nuclear Non-proliferation Treaty (NPT), all of the countries/destinations have committed to maintaining International Atomic Energy Agency safeguards on all of their peaceful nuclear activities and have pledged not to produce or otherwise acquire any nuclear explosive device, therefore satisfying criteria (1) and (2) of Section 109(b) of the AEA, as amended, for exports of nuclear components, substances and items. With regard to Criterion (3) of the AEA Section 109(b), agreement not to retransfer any of the U.S.-supplied nuclear grade graphite without prior U.S. consent has been satisfied by receipt of broad generic assurances from all the destinations listed in the above EB proviso, except Russia and Singapore.

The EB advises that the validity of the license for Poco Graphite should be limited to the expiration date of the current Singapore two-year Import and Delivery Verification Certificate (IDVC), issued on February 10, 2003. This agreement confirms that there will be no retransfer of the U.S.-supplied graphite to any other country without prior U.S. Government consent except to ASEAN countries (Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, and Thailand), all of which are parties to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. In addition, re-exports by Singapore are to be limited to manufactured non-nuclear articles or general license quantities of bulk graphite (Attachment 4).

#### CONCLUSION:

The staff concurs with the Executive Branch's judgment that the issuance of the proposed license amendment, as conditioned above, would not be inimical to the common defense and security of the United States and it also meets the three specific export licensing criteria of Section 109(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended. There are no applicable physical protection requirements for the export of nuclear grade graphite for non-nuclear end use.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Commission authorize the issuance of the amended license with the modifications or conditions requested by the EB, as follows:

- 1. The total amount of nuclear grade graphite for export will be increased to 1,500 short tons (1,360,791 kilograms).
- 2. The maximum allowable individual shipment will be 54,000 kilograms.
- 3. Exports will be limited to ultimate consignees in the countries of the European Union, Canada, Czech Republic, Japan, New Zealand, Romania, Singapore, and Switzerland, and the destination of Taiwan for use by small businesses in non-nuclear end use commercial and industrial applications.
- 4. The license will expire on February 10, 2005.

Effective January 29, 2003, NRC Export License XMAT0400 issued to Poco Graphite, Inc. will expire.

Poco Graphite respectfully requests an extension of the existing license for a period of two (2) years. I am enclosing a company check in the amount of \$9,900.00 to cover the cost of the extension.

I would ask that the following changes/additions be made to the license extension:

- 1. Add an additional 1,500 short tons to the license (1,360,791 kg; 3,000,000 lbs.)

  Sales through Poco Graphite's warehouses in France and Singapore have increased to the point where I anticipate shipping approximately 600,000 pounds in the year 2003 (with 10%-15% increases each year thereafter). As of January 1, 2003, only 585,984 pounds were available to ship on XMAT0400.
- Increase the maximum allowable size of individual shipments to 54,000 kgs.
   The size of replenishment orders for Poco Graphite's warehouse in France have reached the point where multiple container shipments would be advantageous. An increase to 54,000 kgs. would permit shipping three containers at one time.
- 3. Add one specific company located in Moscow, Russia to the license. The company specifics are:

Charmilles Diffusion is the official distributor for Charmilles Mikron Machinery.

Prior license extensions have been subject to Poco Graphite's representative in Singapore obtaining an import/export ICDV Certificate issued by the Trade Development Board of Singapore. I am including a faxed copy of the new Certificate that I received today, January 23<sup>rd</sup>. (The Certificate was issued for a period of two years.) I will forward a copy of the original to you immediately upon my receipt of the certificate from Singapore.

Dear Ms. Lee:

I refer to the letter from your office dated January 28, 2003, requesting the views of the Executive Branch as to whether amendment of an export license in accordance with the application hereinafter described meets the applicable criteria of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended:

NRC No. XMAT0400 – Poco Graphite, Inc. has applied for an amendment of its existing license which authorizes export to various countries of bulk nuclear grade graphite for non-nuclear uses to: 1) increase the total amount authorized for export to all countries combined from 750 short tons (680,385 kilograms) to 1,500 short tons (1,360,791 kilograms); 2) increase the maximum for individual shipments from 18,000 kilograms to 54,000 kilograms; 3) add Charmilles Diffusion, a Russian manufacturer and distributor, as another party to the export; and 4) extend the expiration date from January 29, 2003 to January 29, 2005.

It is the judgment of the Executive Branch that the proposed exports under the requested license amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security of the United States and are consistent with the provisions of the Atomic Energy Act, as amended, provided the license is limited to the quantities specified above to the following countries/destinations: members of the European Union, Canada, Czech Republic, Japan, New Zealand, Romania, Singapore, Switzerland and Taiwan. The exporters request to add a Russian consignee at this time cannot be approved above general license levels until the Russian Government provides the U.S. Government the necessary assurances confirming the right of prior U.S. consent to retransfers of U.S.-origin bulk nuclear grade graphite.

As parties to the NPT, all of the foregoing countries/destinations have committed to maintain IAEA safeguards on all of their peaceful nuclear activities and have pledged not to produce or otherwise acquire any nuclear explosive device. It is therefore the view of the Executive Branch that Criteria (1) and (2) for exports of nuclear components, substances and items under section 109b of the Atomic Energy Act, as amended, are met.

The remaining criterion, agreement not to retransfer any U.S.-supplied component, heavy water or nuclear grade graphite without prior U.S. consent, has been satisfied by receipt of generic assurances from all the countries/destinations, listed in the above proviso except Singapore. These generic assurances confirm the right of U.S. prior consent to retransfers of U.S.-origin nuclear components, heavy water and nuclear grade graphite. Singapore has furnished a new two year Import and Delivery Verification Certificate (IDVC), dated February 10, 2003, which confirms that there will be no retransfer of the U.S.-supplied graphite to any other country without prior U.S. Government consent except to the ASEAN countries—Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines and Thailand.

In view of the foregoing, the validity of the license should be limited to the date of expiration of the current IDVC issued by the Government of Singapore and the license should be conditioned to limit reexports by Singapore to manufactured non-nuclear articles or general license quantities of bulk graphite.

On the basis of the foregoing, the Executive Branch recommends that the license be amended as requested, subject to the provisos set forth above.
