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the Court to resolve all matters raised by the Commission's November 29, 2001 complaint, without admission of liability, and without trial or adjudication of any issue of law or fact.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED as follows:

FINDINGS

- 1. This is an action by plaintiff instituted under Section 13(b) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 53(b). Plaintiff has the authority to seek the relief contained herein, and the complaint states claims upon which relief may be granted against defendants under Section 5 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45.
- 2. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case and all parties thereto. Venue in the Central District of California is proper.
- 3. The activities of defendants are in or affecting commerce, as defined in Section 4 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 44.
- 4. Defendants Salyon, Inc., Mark Joseph Lyon, and John Donald Lyon enter into this Order freely, without admitting liability for any allegation or charge made in the Commission's complaint, without coercion, and acknowledge that they understand the provisions of this Order and are prepared to abide by them.
- 5. The parties shall each bear their own costs and attorney's fees incurred in this action and have waived all claims under the Equal Access to Justice Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2412, and all rights to seek judicial review, or otherwise to challenge the validity of this Order.
 - Entry of this Order is in the public interest.

<u>Definitions</u>

"Assets" mean any legal or equitable interest in, right.

to, or claim to, any real and personal property, including but not limited to chattel, goods, instruments, equipment, fixtures, general intangibles, effects, leaseholds, mail or other deliveries, inventory, checks, notes, accounts, available credit, through credit card accounts or otherwise, receivables (as those terms are defined in the Uniform Commercial Code), cash, funds, property, artwork, coins, precious metals, jewelry, contracts, or shares of stock, that are (1) owned or controlled by defendants, in whole or in part; (2) in the actual or constructive possession of defendants; or (3) owned, controlled by, or in the actual or constructive possession of defendants or any other entity that is directly or indirectly owned or controlled by, or under common control with defendants, including, but not limited to, those held by or for defendants in any account at any bank or savings and loan institution, or with any broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company, commodity trading company, precious metal dealer, merchant account processor, or other Financial institution of any kind.

- 2. "Merchant Cards" mean cards that are typically restricted to use at sources that are owned, controlled, or closely affiliated with the issuing entity, and are accepted at substantially fewer merchants and retail outlets than are credit cards.
- 3. "Defendants" mean Salyon, Inc., Mark Joseph Lyon, and John Donald Lyon by whatever names they might be known.
- I. PROHIBITION ON SELLING CREDIT CARDS AND MERCHANT CARDS

 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that defendants, as well as their successors, assigns, agents, servants, employees, salespersons,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that defendants, as well as their successors, assigns, agents, servants, employees, salespersons, independent contractors, attorneys, and all other persons or entities in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, subsidiary, branch, division, or other entity, are permanently restrained and enjoined from:

A. Misrepresenting, expressly or by implication, that any defendant does or will assist consumers in establishing or improving their credit standing by reporting credit histories to

entities such as the three major credit bureaus, or by any other means or method;

B. Migrepresenting any fact material to a consumer's decision to purchase any product or service sold by any defendant:

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- C. Failing to disclose, clearly and conspicuously, all material conditions and terms of any offer by any defendant to sell any product or service, including those pertaining to any refund or cancellation policies, or the fact that cancellations or refunds are not provided; and
- D. Collecting additional payments for expedited delivery of products or services to consumers unless the defendant: (1) possesses evidence showing that, typically, prior customers who paid fees for expedited delivery did receive products or services in substantially less time than those who did not pay for expedited delivery; or (2) possesses evidence that provides a reasonable basis to represent that customers who pay expedited delivery fees will receive products or services in less time than those who do not pay for expedited delivery.

III. TERMINATION OF ASSET FREEZE

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the freeze on defendants' assets ordered by this Court shall terminate upon entry of this Final Judgment.

IV. COMMISSION'S RELIANCE ON DEFENDANTS' REPRESENTATIONS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission's agreement to this Order is expressly premised on the truthfulness, accuracy, and completeness of the financial condition of defendants as represented in their respective financial statements, i.e.,

Salyon, Inc. (executed by Mark Lyon on Nov. 22, 2001; executed by John Lyon on Nov. 15, 2001); Mark Lyon (Nov. 22, 2001); John Lyon (Nov. 15, 2001), and related documents listed in Attachment B that were submitted to the Federal Trade Commission. financial statements and supporting documents contain material information upon which the Commission relied in negotiating and agreeing to the amount and/or terms of the redress under this 8 Order. If, upon motion by the Commission, this Court finds that any defendant filed a financial statement that failed to disclose 10 any material asset, or materially misrepresented the value of any asset, or made any other material misrepresentation in or 12 omission from the financial statement, the Court shall enter judgment against such defendant, in favor of the Commission, in 13 14 the amount of \$2.7 million, which is intended to represent the amount of loss to consumers/injured parties, and which will 15 16 become immediately due and payable. For purposes of this Section and any subsequent proceedings to enforce payment, including but 17 not limited to a non-dischargeability complaint filed in 18 19 bankruptcy proceedings, defendants waive any right to contest any 20 of the allegations in the Commission's complaint.

ADMINISTRATION OF REDRESS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

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All funds paid pursuant to this Order shall be deposited into a fund administered by the Commission or its agent to be used for equitable relief, including but not limited to consumer redress and any attendant expense for the administration of any redress fund. In the event that direct redress to consumers is wholly or partially impracticable or funds remain after redress

is completed, the Commission may apply any remaining funds for such other equitable relief (including consumer information remodics) as it determines to be reasonably related to the defendants' practices alleged in the complaint. Any funds not used for such equitable relief shall be deposited to the Treasury as disgorgement. Defendants shall have no right to challenge the Commission's choice of remedies under this Section;

- B. If an administrator is employed to administer redress, such administrator may destroy all records relating to this matter six years after the transfer of any remaining redress funds to the FTC Treasury account or the closing of the account from which such funds were disbursed, whichever is earlier, provided that no records shall be destroyed unless and until a representative of the Commission has received and approved the administrator's final accounting report. Records shall be destroyed in accordance with disposal methods and procedures to be specified by the Commission. The Commission may, in its sole discretion, require that such records, in whole or in part, be transferred, in lieu of destruction, to the Commission;
- C. Defendants forever disclaim all right, title, and interest in all sums paid. None of these funds shall be returned to the defendants, their successors, heirs, or assigns. No portion of any payments under the judgment herein shall be deemed a payment of any fine, penalty, or punitive assessment;
- E. Unless previously provided to the FTC, defendants are hereby required, in accordance with 31 U.S.C. § 7701, to furnish to the FTC their respective taxpayer identifying numbers (social security numbers or employer identification numbers), which shall

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be used for purposes of collecting and reporting on any delinquent amount arising out of such persons' relationship with the government; and

E. Proceedings instituted under this Section are in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other civil or criminal remedies that may be provided by law, including any other proceedings the Commission may initiate to enforce this Order.

VI. CUSTOMER LISTS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that defendants, as well as their successors, assigns, agents, servants, employees, salespersons, independent contractors, attorneys, and all other persons or entities in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any sole proprictorship, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, subsidiary, branch, division, or other entity, are hereby permanently restrained and enjoined from selling, renting, leasing, transferring, or otherwise disclosing the name, address, telephone number, social security number, bank account number, or other identifying information of any person who paid money to defendants or Kurt Charles Uhler, who was solicited to pay money to defendants or Kurt Charles Uhler, or whose identifying information was obtained for the purpose of soliciting them to pay money to defendants or Kurt Charles Uhler at any time prior to the date this Order is entered, in connection with the sale of the products or services referenced in the complaint; provided, however, that defendants may disclose such identifying information to a law enforcement agency or as required by any

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law, regulation, or court order.

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VII. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RECEIPT OF ORDER BY DEFENDANT

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, within five business days after receipt by defendants of this Order as entered by the Court, each defendant shall submit to plaintiff a truthful sworn statement, in the form shown on Attachment A, that shall acknowledge receipt of this Order and the truthfulness of the defendant's financial statement.

VIII. COMMISSION'S AUTHORITY TO MONITOR COMPLIANCE

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission is authorized to monitor defendants' compliance with this Order by all lawful means, including but not limited to the following:

- A. The Commission is authorized, without further leave of the Court, to obtain discovery from any person in the manner provided by Chapter V of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Fed. R. Civ. P. 26 37, including the use of compulsory process pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 45, to monitor and investigate defendants' compliance with any provision of this Order;
- B. The Commission is authorized to use representatives posing as consumers or suppliers to defendants, their employees, or any other entity managed or controlled in whole or in part by defendants, without the necessity of identification or prior notice; and
- C. Nothing in this Order shall limit the Commission's lawful use of compulsory process, pursuant to Sections 9 and 20 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 49, 57b-1, to investigate whether defendants have violated any provision of this Order or Section 5 of the FTC Act.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in order that compliance with the provisions of this Order may be monitored:

- A. For a period of five years from the date of entry of this Order, each individual defendant shall notify the Commission of the following:
 - Any changes in residence, mailing addresses, and telephone numbers, within ten days of the date of such change;
 - 2. Any changes in employment status (including self-employment) within ten days of such change. Such notice shall include the name and address of each business that defendants are affiliated with or employed by, a statement of the nature of the business, and a statement of the defendant's duties and responsibilities in connection with the business or employment, and
 - 3. Any proposed change in the structure of any business entity owned or controlled by defendants, such as creation, incorporation, dissolution, assignment, sale, merger, creation or dissolution of subsidiaries, proposed filing of a bankruptcy petition, or change in the corporate name or address, or any other change that may affect compliance obligations arising out of this Order, thirty days prior to the effective date of any proposed change;
- B. One hundred eighty days after the date of entry of this Order, each individual defendant shall provide a written report

- Their then current residence addresses and telephone numbers;
- 2. Their then current employment, business addresses and telephone numbers, a description of the business activities of each such employer, and the defendant's title and responsibilities for each employer;
- 3. A copy of each acknowledgment of receipt of this Order obtained by defendants pursuant to Section X, below;
- 4. A statement describing the manner in which defendants have complied and are complying with Sections I and II of this Order;
- C. Upon written request by a representative of the Commission, defendants shall submit additional written reports (under oath, if requested) and produce documents on fifteen days' notice with respect to any conduct subject to this Order;
- D. For the purposes of this Order, defendants shall, unless otherwise directed by the Commission's authorized representatives, mail all written notifications to the Commission to:

or such other address as the Commission shall designate in

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- E. For the purposes of this Section, "employment" includes the performance of services as an employee, consultant, or independent contractor; and "employers" include any individual or entity for whom defendants perform services as an employee, consultant, or independent contractor; and
- F. For purposes of the compliance reporting required by this Section, the Commission is authorized to communicate directly with defendants Salyon, Inc., Mark Joseph Lyon, and John Donald Lyon, or such other person or attorney designated in writing by such defendant.

X. DISTRIBUTION OF ORDER BY DEFENDANTS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for a period of five years from the date of entry of this Order, defendants, as well as their successors, assigns, agents, servants, employees, salespersons, independent contractors, attorneys, and all other persons or entities in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, subsidiary, branch, division, or other entity, shall:

A. Provide a copy of this Order to, and obtain a signed and dated acknowledgment of receipt of same from: co-shareholders of closely held corporations, all partners, co-owners of limited liability companies, or joint venturer, each officer or director, each individual serving in a management capacity, all entities involved in responding to consumer complaints or inquiries, and all sales entities, whether designated as employees, consultants,

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 independent contractors or otherwise, immediately upon employing, retaining, or contracting with any such entity, for any business where defendant is the majority owner of the business or directly, indirectly, or in concert with others controls the business; and

B. Maintain for a period of three years after creation, and upon reasonable notice, make available to representatives of the Commission, the original signed and dated acknowledgments of the receipt of copies of this Order, as required in Subsection A, of this Section.

XI. ACCESS TO BUSINESS PREMISES

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for a period of five years from the date of entry of this Order, for the purpose of further determining compliance with this Order, detendants shall permit representatives of the Commission, within three business days of receipt of written notice from the Commission:

- A. Access during normal business hours to any office, or facility storing documents, for any business where any defendant is the majority owner of the business or directly or indirectly controls the business. In providing such access, defendants shall permit representatives of the Commission to inspect and copy all documents relevant to any matter contained in this Order; and shall permit Commission representatives to remove documents relevant to any matter contained in this Order for a period not to exceed five business days so that the documents may be inspected, inventoried, and copied; and
- E. To interview the officers, directors, and employees, including all personnel involved in responding to consumer

complaints or inquiries, and all sales personnel, whether designated as employees, consultants, independent contractors or otherwise, of any business to which Subsection A of this Section applies, concerning matters relating to compliance with the terms of this Order. The person interviewed may have counsel present.

Provided that, upon application of the Commission and for good cause shown, the Court may enter an exparts order granting immediate access to defendants' business premises for the purposes of inspecting and copying all documents relevant to any matter contained in this Order.

XII. RECORD KEEPING PROVISIONS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, for a period of eight years from the date of entry of this Order, in connection with any business where any defendant is the majority owner of the business or directly or indirectly controls the business, defendants and their successors, assigns, agents, servants, employees, salespersons, independent contractors, attorneys, and all other persons or entities in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, subsidiary, branch, division, or other entity, are hereby restrained and enjoined from failing to create and retain the following records:

- A. Accounting records that reflect the cost of goods or services sold, revenues generated, and the disbursement of such revenues;
- B. Personnel records accurately reflecting: the name,

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address, and telephone number of each person employed in any capacity by such business, including as at independent contractor; that person's job title or position; the date upon which the person commenced work; and the date and reason for the person's termination, if applicable;

- C. Customer files containing the names, addresses, phone numbers, dollar amounts paid, quantity of items or services purchased, and description of items or services purchased, to the extent such information is obtained in the ordinary course of business;
- D. Complaint and refund requests (whether received directly, indirectly or through any third party) and any responses to those complaints or requests; and
- Ε. Copies of all sales scripts, training materials, advertisements, or other marketing materials.

XIII. SERVICE OF ORDER

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that plaintiff's attorneys, agents, or employees may serve this Order upon any financial institution, or other entity or person that may have possession, custody, control, or knowledge of any assets of defendants, or any other entity or person that may be otherwise subject to any provision of this Order, by delivering a copy of the Order by any means, including facsimile transmission, to any office, branch, or location.

XIV. RECEIVERSHIP ACTIONS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all entities are hereby permanently enjoined from filing or otherwise commencing in any court other than this one any suit, action, or other proceeding directed against the Receiver arising from or related to any acts undertaken or omissions made by the Receiver in the course of administering the receivership estate in this case. RETENTION OF JURISDICTION XV. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for all purposes, Defendants and the Commission through its counsel, hereby consent to the terms and conditions of this Order as set forth above and consent to the entry thereof.
