# AGREED ORDER

The Court, having been advised that Defendants Marc Dann and Plaintiffs John Doe

I, John Doe II, John Doe III, and John Doe IV, through counsel, are in agreement to the

following, it is hereby ordered that:

- 1. The parties shall be bound by the terms of this Order until further Order from this Court.
- 2. Unless otherwise provided herein, the changes made to the Ohio Revised Code by Amended Substitute Senate Bill 10 ("S.B. 10") shall remain unaffected by this Order. This Order applies only to Plaintiffs and members of Plaintiffs' putative class, and does not apply to any offender who is sentenced on or after January 1, 2008, or any delinquent child determined to be a juvenile offender registrant on or after January 1, 2008.
- 3. The 60-day filing deadlines of R.C. 2950.031(E) and R.C. 2950.032(E) as amended by S.B. 10 shall be considered unexpired for Plaintiffs and all members of Plaintiffs' putative class until further Order from this Court. All petitions which have already been filed pursuant to R.C. 2950.031(E) and R.C. 2950.032(E) or which are filed during the pendency of this Order are timely filed under R.C. 2950.031(E) and 2950.032(E).
- 4. The community notification provisions of R.C. 2950.11(A) as amended by S.B. 10 shall be stayed for Plaintiffs and all members of the Plaintiffs' putative class, except that community notification shall

still apply to any Plaintiff and any member of Plaintiffs' putative class to whom community notification applied under the law prior to the amendments made by S.B. 10.

- 5. Nothing in this Order shall prohibit any party from making sex offender classification records available to the public on request pursuant to R.C. 149.43, R.C. 2950.11(J) as amended by S.B. 10, and/or R.C. 2950.081 as amended by S.B. 10. Nothing in this Order shall prohibit any party from posting sex offender records online and/or issuing notifications by request pursuant to R.C. 2950.13, R.C. 2950.11(J), and/or R.C. 2950.081 as amended by S.B. 10.
- 6. Except as allowed in paragraph 4 above, no party shall take affirmative action to publish any sex offender classification records other than through public record requests pursuant to R.C. 149.43; online publication pursuant to R.C. 2950.13 and R.C. 2950.081 as amended by S.B. 10; and notifications by request pursuant to R.C. 2950.13, R.C. 2950.11(J), and/or R.C. 2950.081 as amended by S.B. 10.
- 7. Nothing in this Order shall modify the registration requirements of R.C. 2950.04, R.C. 2950.041, R.C. 2950.05, and R.C. 2950.06 as amended by S.B. 10, or the criminal penalties for the failure to comply with those registration requirements pursuant to R.C. 2950.99 as amended by S.B. 10.
- 8. This agreed order does not interfere with or otherwise affect the terms of an order that has been or will be issued by any Ohio court which provides additional injunctive or declaratory relief to any Plaintiffs or any member of the Plaintiffs' putative class.
- 9. The defendant sheriffs of all 88 Ohio counties have agreed to be bound by the terms of this agreed Order whether or not represented by counsel of record in this matter.
