RESOLUTION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

Endorsement of the "Recommendations for San Juan River Operation and RE: Administration for 2004"

RESOLUTION NO. 2003-R-615-12

WHEREAS, the Legislative Council of the Jicarilla Apache Nation approved the endorsement of the "Recommendations for San Juan River Operations and Administration for 2003" that resulted in a mechanism for a number of San Juan basin water users to share shortages from direct flows and storage in Navajo Reservoir as a result of continuing drought in the region: AND

WHEREAS, the 2003 agreement also provided for the opportunity for the Nation to lease up to 20,000 acre-feet of its future use water rights for emergency supplemental water supplies to the power producing interests and the clients of the San Juan Water Commission; AND

WHEREAS, the 2004 agreement is similar to the 2003 agreement in that all previously agreed to matters associated with the sharing of shortages and uses of the Nation's future use water rights remains the same; AND

WHEREAS, the 2004 agreement is an equitable approach in dealing with drought induced shortages from the Navajo Reservoir Supply with the only alternative being a priority call on the river likely leading to the filing of suits and much political strife; AND NOW

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislative Council of the Jicarilla Apache Nation, the Legislative Council does hereby approve the signing of the endorsement letter by the President representing the Nation's position in supporting the "Recommendations for San Juan River Operations and Administration for 2004".

FURIITER RESOLVED, that Mr. Mike Hamman, Ms. Andrea LeFevre and Mr. Lester Taylor will continue to represent the Nation at future meetings associated with this process.


