Suspensions (3 bills):

- 1) **H.Con.Res. 45** – Recognizing the benefits and importance of school-based music education (Rep. Cooper – Education & the Workforce).
- 2) **H.Con.Res. 5** – Providing for the acceptance of a statue of Sarah Winnemucca, presented by the people of Nevada, for placement in National Statuary Hall (Rep. Gibbons – House Administration).
- 3) **H.Con.Res. 63** – Permitting the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for a ceremony as part of the commemoration of the days of remembrance of victims of the Holocaust (Rep. Ney – House Administration).

Suspensions (2 bills):

- 1) **S.Con.Res. 13** – Congratulating ASME on their 125th anniversary, celebrating the achievements of ASME members, and expressing the gratitude of the American people for ASME's contributions (Sen. Sununu – Science).
- 2) **H.R. 912** – To ensure the protection of beneficiaries of United States humanitarian assistance (Rep. Delahunt – International Relations).

H.R. 27 – Job Training Improvement Act of 2005 (Rep. McKeon – Education & the Workforce) (Subject to a Rule)

H.R. 841 – To require States to hold special elections to fill vacancies in the House of Representatives not later than 45 days after the vacancy is announced by the Speaker of the House of Representatives in extraordinary circumstances (Rep. Sensenbrenner – House Administration) (Subject to a Rule)
