

Appomattox Court House Virginia

April 10 1865

Agreement entered into this day in regard to the Surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia to the United States Authorities.



1st The troops shall march by Regiments and Detachments to a designated point, stack their Arms, deposit their Flags, Sabres, Pistols, etc. ^{from} and thence march to their Homes under charge of their Officers, superintended by their respective Division and Corps Commanders, Officers, retaining their Side Arms, and the authorized number of private Horses.

2^d All public Horses and public Property of all kinds to be turned over to staff Officers designated by the United States Authorities.

3^d Such transportation, as may be agreed upon as necessary for the transportation of the private baggage of Officers will be allowed to accompany the Officers, to be turned over at the end of the trip, to the nearest U. S. Quartermaster's receipts being taken for the same.

4th Drivers and Mounted men of the Artillery and Cavalry whose Horses are their own private Property will be allowed to retain them.
