Nevada Test Site Loans Exhibits To the Central Nevada Museum in Tonopah, Nevada

The U.S. Department of Energy, National Nuclear Security Administration Nevada Site Office, Environmental Management Program has loaned to the Central Nevada Museum in Tonopah, Nevada, a model of the Area 5 low-level waste disposal pits located at the Radioactive Waste Management Site on the Nevada Test Site (NTS), in addition to two other displays: the *Radioactive Waste Disposal at the NTS* timeline poster and the *Groundwater...at the NTS* poster.

The Radioactive Waste timeline poster is a historical perspective of activities that took place at the NTS from the 1950's to present day, including the number of waste shipments. The Groundwater poster depicts questions and answers about the Underground Test Area (UGTA) Project, including the objective and strategy for dealing with groundwater contamination.

The public and media are invited to visit these displays at the Central Nevada Museum located at 1900 Logan Field Road, Tonopah, Nevada. The museum is open from 10:00 am – 5:00 pm Wednesday through Sunday. The museum closes for lunch from 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm. Admission into the museum is free, while donations are welcome.
