Clark High School Wins Science Bowl

Return champions, Clark High School, prevailed over 32 other high school teams from Arizona, Nevada, and Utah at the 13th Annual Nevada Regional Science Bowl, which took place today at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. Clark High School will represent the Nevada region at the National Science Bowl competition in Washington, D.C. April 30-May 3, 2004.

The Clark team included Young Ran, Alex Cerjanic, Yang Wang, Ryan Weicker, Henry Wong and coach/teacher Beth Isaacs. The team defeated Foothill High School in the final round. Teams were quizzed in the areas of math and science during the competition hosted by the U.S. Department of Energy's National Nuclear Security Administration Nevada Site Office.

- Clark High School received \$2,500 from the U.S. Department of Energy's Office of Repository Development, to be used in the school's science and math departments, matching team book bags, and an all-expense paid trip to the National Science Bowl competition.
- Foothill High School's Team A placed second and received \$2,000 sponsored by Stoller-Navarro.
- Wooster High School finished third and received \$1,500 sponsored by the Desert Research Institute.
- Proctor Hug placed fourth and received \$1,000 from Bechtel SAIC Company, LLC.
- Advanced Technologies Academy's Team B tied with The Meadows School for fifth place to win \$500 each, sponsored by Nevada Power Company.
- Shadow Ridge High School tied for seventh place with Cedar City High School to collect \$300 each, sponsored by U.S. Department of Energy-Nevada Site Office/Environmental Management.
- Green Valley High School, Foothill Team B, Advanced Technologies Academy Team A, and George Whittell all tied for ninth place to receive \$100 each from Bechtel Nevada.
- Sparks High School took home the Good Sportsmanship Award. Each team member received a backpack, and their coach received two airline tickets compliments of Southwest Airlines.

The U.S. Department of Energy established the Science Bowl in 1991 to motivate high school students to pursue scientific and technical careers and promote science and mathematics literacy. Since the establishment of Science Bowl, more than 80,000 young men and women from all over the country have participated in this competition.
