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#### **Executive summary**

The new contract for the 2006-2011 five-year period was begun this quarter with the University of Massachusetts Medical School's Lamar Soutter Library being award the NN/LM contract for the New England Region. Moving into the second five-year contract without staff changes has allowed for a seamless flow of work in program areas. New initiatives in course development, library advocacy, and an extensive exhibit schedule will continue from one contract to the next. New plans for the Regional Advisory Council, technology related course development and programs, public health outreach, task forces, and other new initiatives will commence.

For fiscal reasons, NER's funding under the previous contract was extended by a full quarter. Though no new funding announcements were made, a number of previously issued subcontracts were extended into the additional quarter. A mid-quarter budget review allowed NER to assess available funding in order to request Express Outreach proposals from members who had made solicitations and did not receive funding the previous year. Funding these projects allowed new and old outreach to continue throughout the region without interruption or long gaps in awarding worthy projects. Nine Express Outreach projects and one Library Improvement (Electronic Document Delivery) project were awarded.

For the new contract the Regional Advisory Council was convened with new members. A call for participation was issued and members were assigned specific areas of the RAC (Subcommittees, Working Groups). The initial meeting provided a detailed overview of NER programs and its goals and objective for the coming contract period. Twenty-two members joined the Regional Advisory Council meeting on July 20.

NER directors and coordinators attended the Medical Library Association conference in Phoenix, AZ in May. NER attended RML Directors Meetings, WebSTOC's WebDevConference, and related breakout sessions.

Across the region and at venues at Medical Library Association conference, staff conducted fifteen presentations to 286 participants. These sessions included topics such as PubMed, consumer health, DOCLINE, and evidence-based public health resources.

### Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) activities

Much work was done to convene the Regional Advisory Committee for the upcoming years. A call for participation went out to the regional distribution list and the NER newsletter. Additional members were invited to fill Subcommittee and Working Group positions.

The Regional Advisory Committee met on July 20 at the Hoagland-Pincus Conference Center in the Shrewsbury campus of UMMS. Most volunteers for the RAC were able to attend the meeting. Twenty-two librarians from 20 member libraries attended the meeting. The agenda included briefing the RAC on all NER program areas. NER Coordinators discussed their roles and responsibilities for each program area. NER Program Summaries, Program Objective Tables, and RAC rosters were distributed to each member attending the meeting. Coordinators also discussed the work of their respective Subcommittees and Working Groups. The meeting concluded with a general brainstorming session for each of the task forces to be convened according to the NER contract proposal. Ideas and contact information was gathered for task forces to be convened on Historical Collections and Emergency Preparedness.

#### Needs assessment and evaluation activities/data

Assessments were discussed according to NER program areas at the RAC meeting mentioned above.

Staff have been participating in ongoing Outreach Evaluation Resource Center teleconferences. The evaluation liaison is Javier Crespo.

# MedlinePlus Go Local

The Massachusetts Go Local continues its work in adding and maintaining resource records with the help of its advisory board. Mass Go Local serves as a successful model for implementation for the region.

The Vermont MedlinePlus Go Local implementation project is in development. Plans call for Vermont Go Local going online in the Fall of current year.

The Resource Library in New Hampshire (Dartmouth) continues discussing its plan for a proposal for Go Local implementation in that state. Librarians there have consulted with implementation projects in Massachusetts and Vermont to formulate their own plan.

Resource Libraries in Rhode Island have discussed Go Local with NER Director and Associate Directors. Rhode Island Department of Health officials have been approached in the past year about the possibility of Go Local for that state. Budget circumstances have not made further discussions possible.
