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Executive summary

In this first quarter of Year 2 all four funded subcontracts are in early phases of operation. In addition a Go Local implementation project proposal was submitted and approved for the state of Connecticut. The Stowe Library at the University of Connecticut Health Center will manage the implementation of Go Local Connecticut.

Two RAC Subcommittee meetings were held with web-based conferencing. The Education Working Group developed a needs assessment to be administered to members in the region. The Consumer Health Advisory Subcommittee was also convened. The advisory group was briefed on the previous years activity and feedback was sought on content being developed for new online courses.

Across the region staff conducted twenty three instructional sessions to 312 participants. These sessions included PubMed and consumer health topics. Distance-based extended DOCLINE training sessions are also being conducted with individual members.

NER exhibited at two national conferences and three regional exhibiting events. NER exhibited at a meeting of the American Academy of Neurology and the American Optometric Association. Local exhibiting included school library, school health and public health nurses groups.

A quarterly edition of the NN/LM—NER newsletter, the NER'eastah, was issued online.

Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) and needs assessment activities

Plans are under way to convene the Regional Advisory Council in August 2007.

The Education Working Group of the RAC developed and administered an Education Needs Assessment Survey for all NER network members. The assessment was administered via the WebMonkey tool. Findings will be presented to the RAC at the planned meeting.

NER staff have begun consideration of other assessments for NER program areas.

On May 22nd, Michelle Eberle hosted a Consumer Health Advisory Board teleconference. Members were briefed on NER's consumer health program. Members suggested assisting in communicating related communications to their respective states. Members were asked to review instructional sessions that are currently in development.

Both Education and Consumer Health bodies of the RAC were convened this month using Adobe Connect (formerly Adobe Breeze). The UMass campus recently established training and other resources for using the locally licensed utility.

The Hospital Library Subcommittee members developed, submitted, and presented a poster session on hospital library advocacy services conducted in the New England region as supported by the Subcommittee.

Update of ongoing major projects (funded at ≥ \$15,000)

Four subcontracts are currently in early phases of operation. The projects were approved in Year One and are in their early phases of initial meetings and equipment purchases. Below are project descriptions.

Littleton Regional Hospital, Gale Medical Library, Northern New Hampshire Health Information Outreach will conduct a pilot project at three sites in northern New Hampshire that do not have convenient (if any) access to health sciences library services. Cottage Hospital in Woodsville, NH, Indian Stream Health Center in Colebrook, NH, and The Morrison in Whitefield, NH. The primary goal of this project is so that Health professionals at rural health care facilitated in the northern New Hampshire will have regular access to health information resources in order to provide high quality care.

Treadwell Library at Massachusetts General Hospital will establish an onsite Health Information Resource Center at the CAPIC (Community Action Programs, Inter City, Inc.) Head Start Program in Chelsea, MA. CAPIC Head Start serves low-income families with young children in Chelsea, Revere, and Winthrop. Many families are recent immigrants. The Project team will create a physical resource room and a web site containing resources on general child health and wellness, nutrition and healthy eating. The Project team will teach parents and Head Start staff how to find and use appropriate and authoritative health information.

University of Vermont Connecting Patients, Providers, and the Community with Quality Health Information: This project will assess the use of consumer health information in a clinical setting located in a rural, and economically disadvantaged community. Dana Medical Library will team with medical and professional staff of the Milton Family Practice to provide educational modules on quality patient and consumer health sources. The partners will also enhance the ability of the Milton Public Library and the Milton Family Community Center to support the health information needs of the community.

Yale University's Information Needs of Connecticut School Nurses: This project is designed to determine the information needs of Connecticut school nurses and to develop resources and training that match those needs. The information needs of the school nurse population have not been reported in the literature, and it is therefore assumed that it is an understudied area. The project will center on the use of a survey as well as focus groups as the main tools to discover how school nurses currently find new information, what their needs are, and what would be the most helpful way for them to access information in the future. Results of the data collection will be analyzed to develop a strategy of information delivery and potential training opportunities.

Consumer Health Coordinator Michelle Eberle is collaborating with Siobahn Champ-Blackwell of the Mid-Continental Region on "Spring into Health". Spring into Health is a series of six electronic messages called 'Information Bytes'. Message topics include nutrition, ergonomics, stress management, and nutrition and are designed to encourage healthy lifestyles in the workplace. The messages include general information, tips, and links to health information resources on MedlinePlus. As a pilot, the messages were sent to the NNLM-All electronic list and are part of an ongoing project to develop a workplace wellness workshop and present at ALA Meeting in 2008. Six topics were developed and posted.

Michelle is also collaborating with Terri Ottosen on the development on the Beyond an Apple a Day class into a hybrid distance learning class. The class will be offered in September and will be open to members in both regions.
