- 3 JONI EASTLEY: Thanks for providing a lecturn
- 4 that makes me look tall. Appreciate that. Good afternoon,
- 5 my name is Joni Eastley. I'm Vice Chair of the Nye County
- 6 Board of Commissioners.
- 7 As you are well aware, Nye is the site county
- 8 for the proposed repository at Yucca Mountain. As
- 9 commissioners, we are responsible for developing county
- 10 policy as it relates to this project, then communicating
- 11 that policy to our nuclear waste repository office for
- 12 implementation. I appreciate DOE's scheduling one of
- 13 these hearings in Nye County. Thank you very much.
- Nye is a cooperating agency on the supplement
- 15 to the EIS, and we're pleased to have had an opportunity
- 16 to work with DOE to ensure that our interests and
- 17 concerns are included in that document.
- 18 Although we reserve the right to make
- 19 additional comments, I don't anticipate -- other than
- 20 what my colleague is going to say after I speak -- any
- 21 formal comments beyond those that I will make today.
- Nye County will, however, submit formal
- 23 comments for the record on the Rail Alignment EIS, and
- 24 we anticipate doing that on or before January 10th,
- 25 2008.

First, I want to say that Nye County is the

- 2 site county for this repository. That decision was made
- 3 long ago, and that decision was made by others.
- 4 Nye County was not consulted, and we had no say in its
- 5 selection.

- 6 But regardless of being excluded from the
- 7 decision-making process, as elected officials, we have
- 8 pragmatically chosen to actively and constructively
- 9 engage DOE in this process.
- We are firm in our resolve concerning this.
- 11 And until the law changes, if it ever does, we believe
- 12 that we need to do everything in our power to represent
- our citizens by providing the oversight that is needed
- 14 to do four things.
- The first is to protect the health, safety,
- 16 economic well-being and quality of life of our
- 17 residents. Second, we want to provide the oversight
- 18 needed to protect the environment.
- Third, ensure that the repository operates
- 20 safely and successfully. And, fourth, ensure that
- 21 whatever transportation system is put in place operates
- 22 safely and serves to advance opportunities for economic
- 23 development throughout the county.
- The Nuclear Waste Policy Act was signed into
- 25 law in 1982. It was amended in 1987 to make
- 1 Yucca Mountain the only site characterized. And then
 - 2 Congress formally designated the site in 2002.
 - My colleagues and I refuse to ignore this law
 - 4 and lazily assume that the State will prevail in its
 - 5 opposition to this project. It would be dangerous and
 - 6 irresponsible not to constructively engage DOE during
 - 7 this process when we have so much to lose by not doing
 - 8 so.
 - 9 The various political leaders of both parties

- 10 insist that decisions about Yucca Mountain should be
- 11 based on sound science, and we agree with that. Through
- 12 its independent scientific oversight program, Nye County
- 13 has produced approximately 30 million dollars worth of
- 14 studies, and what we have observed is that this is not
- only a technically feasible project, but that it can be
- 16 done safely.
- In fact, we have reason to believe that the
- 18 environmental impact of nuclear weapons tests at the
- 19 Nevada Test Site, which, I'd like to point out to
- 20 everyone, is also wholly-contained within the borders of
- 21 Nye County, up gradient from Yucca Mountain, puts
- 22 Nye County citizens, at least in the relative nearer
- 23 term, at a much greater risk than this repository ever
- 24 will.
- I firmly believe that as long as this is a
- 1 retrievable repository, as opposed to the dump that it
 - 2 has been so commonly referred to lately, that we would
 - 3 all be better served if it was viewed as a natural
 - 4 energy reserve and its contents as a resource.
 - 5 As I noted previously, Nye is a cooperating
 - 6 agency in the Supplemental EIS. Of particular note in
 - 7 our display that you can see in the back of the room
 - 8 here is a news release that announces the results of a
 - 9 rail economic study suggesting that west central Nevada
 - 10 could actually realize significant economic benefit from
 - 11 the construction of the railroad designed to serve the
 - 12 repository.

- 13 Also included is a position paper prepared by
- 14 the Savannah River Site Community Reuse Organization
- 15 that sets forth their views of how important
- 16 Yucca Mountain is to them in the context of energy
- 17 independence and sufficiency, the nuclear renaissance,
- 18 and energy policy in general.
- 19 As can be seen through these documents,
- 20 Yucca Mountain does not stand alone in the arenas of
- 21 energy policy and economic growth. Many reputable
- 22 experts and experienced managers and planners in similar
- 23 areas see the value of this project.
- In the end, Nye County expects that the people
- 25 who will ultimately work at Yucca Mountain will live in
- 1 Nye County as opposed to riding busses to and from
 - 2 Las Vegas, which is done now. And when and where it
 - 3 makes sense, we also believe that the businesses and
 - 4 industries associated with the repository should be
 - 5 located right here in Nye County.
 - 6 Finally, consider the irony that at one time
 - 7 Nevada's political leadership actually endorsed this
 - 8 project and even attempted to segregate the
 - 9 Yucca Mountain site in a separate county. I'm sure you
 - 10 all remember what that was, Bullfrog County.
 - In the context of contemporary politics where
 - 12 responsible government would have us find solutions as
 - 13 opposed to political opportunities, it can be certainly
 - 14 said that we were for it before we were against it.
 - As I said earlier, the law is what it is, and
 - 16 until it changes or the State prevails in the courts, we

- intend to remain actively and constructively engaged
- with DOE until the very end.
- The time has come for -- to either advance or
- 20 terminate this program based on its merits but only on
- 21 its merits. The NRC has been charged with that
- 22 responsibility. And regardless of one's position, even
- 23 for or against, we need to see an end to the stalling
- 24 tactics and politicizing of science and bring this
- 25 project to a completion. Thank you.
