11 California. [I feel that the EIS needs to elaborate |
12 more on the truck hauling of the waste if the
13 Caliente corridor is not built.

14 And I belong to the Timbisha Shoshone tribe
15 who has acreage, you know, what is it, seven miles
16 down the road in Death Valley Junction, and I'm
17 really concerned that if we're going to, if they are
18 going to be using trucks to haul the waste, it's
19 going to come, you know, within 50 feet of our
20 reservation lands.]

21 [So I'm kind of worried about the impacts, 2
22 not only that but also the impacts of the
23 contamination of groundwater in the Amargosa River
24 which empties out into Death Valley National Park
25 where our headquarters is located.]

1 [Socioeconomic impacts to our tribes also is 3
2 a concern, as we were going to do something down here
3 at Death Valley Junction. What we're looking at
4 right now is wind energy. We've got a monitor at
5 Scotty's Junction where we have additional acreage up
6 there, we're looking at wind monitoring. We have one
7 of those tower things up right now and they're
8 measuring the wind to see if it's a viable project
9 for a wind energy project. Those are the things I'm
10 concerned about.]
