

18 KENNY ANDERSON: My name is Kenny Anderson. [I'm
19 a member of the Las Vegas Paiute Tribe. I'm the
20 environmental program manager for the tribe and cultural
21 representative for the tribe. The Las Vegas Paiute Tribe
22 has concerns with some of the technical information
23 concerning the hydrology, that's like the water movement.

24 We'll be giving information later about this,
25 but we're actually concerned with the transportation,
1 the rail system. It's going to go -- actually,
2 everybody knows it's going to go through southern Nevada
3 and it's going to go through a lot of cultural sites.
4 Hundreds of cultural sites will be disturbed. That's
5 all the history of America we're talking about. They're
6 going to be either thrown away or put in a museum
7 somewhere. But that has to be another thing that we
8 have to look at, too.

9 And we talk about the -- some of the history
10 with the Downwinders, and a lot of the native people
11 lived in the area that Gary Reese lived in, but they're
12 not anymore. They're gone because of all the fallout
13 that was given out by the nuclear test back in the days.

14 But they're not there. My mother is one of
15 those persons. She never got compensated for her -- her
16 illness with leukemia. So that never came to be. So as
17 a member of the tribe, we oppose the rail shipment and
18 the storage of nuclear waste at the Yucca Mountain site.
