The planned dumping of nuclear waste on Yucca Mtn, NV, should not be allowed until a full disclosure of all the potential risks and impacts are reported. The EIR fails to address many potential risk factors such as container strength, emergency response in the event of an accident, and containment of nuclear radiation along the transportation route.

Specific information should be included, such as:

- How the transport, aging, and disposal (TAD) containers are designed and built, and how they will be loaded, moved, and secured during transport.
- 3 An accident record of the train company being used to transport the waste should be analyzed and considered.
- There should be a plan regarding how to continually monitor the radioactive emissions at the dumpsite for the remainder of the nuclear deterioration period.
- 5 A better description of DOE's schedule to store and remove nuclear waste at the reactor site and the transport of waste to the proposed disposal sites.
- A disclosure of presumed or potential health risks to anyone working near the waste during transport or in the vicinity of the trains, and that measures be taken to give proper advance warning to those potentially at risk.

These are only a few of many concerns ${\tt I}$ have about the DOE's plans to dump nuclear waste at Yucca Mtn.
