**Can I republish EHP content?**

It depends. Because EHP and EHP Chinese Edition are U.S. government publications, their content is not subject to copyright. For articles that are being reprinted from EHP or EHP Chinese Edition, we ask only that you clearly identify EHP or EHP Chinese Edition as the source and provide a complete citation for the article. If the article you wish to reprint contains photographs or illustrations, please contact Ms. Hui Hu at [\*\*hu@niehs.nih.gov\*\*](mailto:hu@niehs.nih.gov) for information on any copyright restrictions that may apply. If you wish to republish EHP content that has already been translated into another language and published by one of our partners, we ask that you contact the partner journal prior to republishing. In any case, we ask that you notify EHP of your intentions to reproduce material. This helps us track the impact of our International Program.
