Dear Mr. Fine and Mr. Jarrett:

We are writing to request that your offices conduct a thorough investigation and report on the troubling allegations of selective, politically-motivated prosecution in recent years by the Department of Justice. Just as your offices have cooperated in the ongoing review of the unprecedented firing of nine U.S. Attorneys in 2006 and allegations of politically-motivated hiring at the Department, we believe it is important that your offices investigate this matter, which seriously threatens the reputation and integrity of the Department and the federal justice system.

Enclosed with this letter is a copy of a report just issued by the House Judiciary Committee's majority staff on "Allegations of Selective Prosecution in Our Federal Criminal Justice System." The report describes the results so far of the investigation by the Committee and its majority staff into serious allegations that criminal prosecutions have been brought by federal prosecutors under the current Administration for political reasons, reflecting similar concerns about political interference with the justice system as have led to the investigation of the U.S. Attorney firings.

These concerns extend far beyond the Committee and the Congress. As the report documents, former federal prosecutors, 44 former state Attorneys General, and former Attorney General Richard Thornburgh have expressed serious misgivings about, in Attorney General Thornburgh's words, "apparent political prosecution." A 2007 academic study of the problem concluded that the current Administration's criminal investigations of Democrats vs.




Republicans is "highly disproportionate" and that statistically, there is "less than one chance in 10,000" that this disproportion has occurred by chance. As Attorney General Thornburgh lamented, our citizens "may no longer" have "confidence that the Department of Justice is conducting itself in a fair and impartial manner without actual political influence or the appearance of political influence."


Under these circumstances, it is critical that the Department undertake a thorough and fair internal review of this problem, which unfortunately has not yet been undertaken, to help determine any possible wrongdoing and restore the confidence of the American people in our federal justice system. We look forward to your offices undertaking this important project, and pledge to cooperate in any way possible. 
