Incredible as it may seem, our Federal Trade Commission is proposing that the current standards relating to the "'Made in USA" label be relaxed to allow foreign goods to be labeled as U.S.-made.

This proposal is clearly intended to confuse consumers by distorting the meaning of "Made in USA," thereby eliminating patriotic buying habits, which the FTC regards as a troublesome world-trade obstacle.

If implemented, it will surely destroy whatever is left of pure American manufacturing.
