

**Michael Slater** is deputy director of Project Vote, the country's premier nonpartisan voter registration organization. He came to Project Vote in 2004 with eleven years experience in community, labor and faith-based organizing and has held his current position since 2006. For the past four years, his work focuses primarily on ensuring the voting rights of low-income and minority Americans. During his tenure with Project Vote, Mr. Slater has helped lead a successful effort to overturn laws in seven states restricting voter registration, including *Project Vote v. Blackwell*, contributed to the passage of election legislation in half a dozen states and has authored or edited numerous publications on election policy. Mr. Slater directs Project Vote's NVRA Implementation Project, which seeks to ensure that states are in compliance with the public agency registration requirements (Section 7) of the National Voter Registration Act. He splits his time between Washington, D.C. and his home in Salem, Oregon.
