The State of West Virginia Fifty States project will organize a new statewide coordinating structure for advancing the National Spatial Data Infrastructure in West Virginia. The vision of the new coordinating structure is to have a broader representation that includes the private sector, academia, and all levels of government. It will strive to include high-level champions who understand geospatial technologies and funding issues in the form of elected officials or executive decision makers in the coordination process. The new coordinating body will develop the strategic and business plans necessary to leverage resources and minimize redundancies in the integration and publishing of standardized geospatial data from multiple sources. Lastly, it will seek formal political recognition, either through executive level or legislative action, and identify a source of sustainable funding from state government.

(2) Key Accomplishments to Date:

The primary objective of organizing a new geospatial coordinating body, named the WV Association of Geospatial Professionals (WVAGP), has been successfully completed.

- Drafting of Proposed Bylaws: All interested members who attended the first organizational meeting in Septembers 2006 were invited to participate in the committee to draft the proposed bylaws. Twenty-two individuals from federal, state, and local government, education and research, and the private sector volunteered to serve on the bylaws committee. Parliamentary procedures set forth in *Robert's Rules of Order* and other resources were utilized to create the association's bylaws, including the hiring of a professional registered parliamentarian. The full committee convened three times between October 2006 and February 2007 to draft the bylaws. During this time period, the committee diligently deliberated on drafting the governance rules, all the while ensuring that the proposed bylaws were democratic and that the members had the ultimate say in the new association. In February 2007, the bylaws committee distributed the proposed bylaws and committee report to the prospective members for their review.
- Consideration Adoption of Bylaws, Enrollment of Charter Members, and Election of Officers: The WV Association of Geospatial Professionals became a permanent organization on Thursday, March 15, 2007. At the charter meeting the bylaws were adopted, 53 members were enrolled as charter members, and the officers were elected (See Appendix A).

(2) Next Steps:

- New Coordinating Body WV Association of Geospatial Professionals: Next steps involve branding and creating marketing material for the new association; setting up the financial accounts; forming standing committees; and creating the association's website. The association is also filing to be a nonprofit under the Internal Revenue Code section 501(c)(3), and will hire a professional service to assist with processing the application.
- Formal Recognition of Association by State: The association has sent a letter to the General Counsel of the Governor's Office, requesting a legal opinion on how closely the nonprofit association can be affiliated with state government within the framework of state and federal laws.
- Strategic Plan: The next meeting of the members will be June 5, 2007, in Flatwoods, WV, to develop the framework for a comprehensive State GIS Plan.


(4) Helpful Assistance from CAP Program:
