


Change in Nonfarm Employment




# The Bush Economy Private Sector Job Growth Among the Worst of Any Administration in over 75 Years

# The Bush Economy Slow Job Growth Has Turned Into Job Losses


Monthly Change in Nonfarm Payrolls Seasonally Adjusted, September 2005 - September 2008

**Civilian Unemployment Rate** 





**Civilian Unemployment** 





Output per Hour and Real Compensation per Hour, Nonfarm Business Sector



## The Bush Economy Real Earnings Growth Weak and Unequal Relative to 1990s Expansion


Change in Real Usual Weekly Earnings of Full-Time Workers


#### The Bush Economy Large Projected Surpluses Turned into Large Deficits

Surpluses and Deficits Compared with CBO Baseline Projections FY 2000 - 2009




# The Bush Economy \$4.2 Trillion More Debt in FY 2008

**Bush Administration Projections of Public Debt in 2008** 





Average Amount of 2001-2006 Tax Cuts by Household Income, 2008





**Real Median Household Income** 






