Since last winter, home heating fuel prices have increased 49 percent. In response to this recent spike in costs, this budget amendment would increase the FY 2005 appropriations request for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program to ensure that resources are adequate to meet the energy needs of low-income households.

The amendment provides \$100 million in additional block grant funds, revises the request to provide \$300 million in contingency funding, and designates this entire \$300 million as an emergency requirement.
