Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am transmitting an update on the use of the Emergency Response Fund (ERF) appropriations. This report covers the use of the \$40 billion provided by P.L. 107-38, the FY 2001 Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Recovery from and Response to Terrorist Attacks on the United States, and P.L. 107-117, the FY 2002 Department of Defense and Emergency Supplemental Appropriations for Recovery from and Response to Terrorist Attacks on the United States. As of the end of November, the Executive Branch agencies have reported total obligations of \$38.6 billion, bringing the total to over 99 percent of the amount provided after taking into account rescissions and reallocations enacted by Congress.

The remaining research funds have been allocated and continue to be obligated for the development and validation of assays targeting rapid detection of high consequence animal and plant pathogens. The remaining physical security funds continue to be obligated for improved security measures at select priority locations. The majority of the remaining physical security funds are expected to be obligated in the first quarter of FY 2005.

^{***}The Food Safety and Inspection Service has approximately \$1.1 million in unobligated balances. The remaining funds are being used to expand laboratory chemical and bacterial testing capabilities (\$0.4 million), continue to update the COOP (\$0.5 million) and continue to fund a variety of activities begun with the Homeland Security supplemental (\$0.2 million).

^{****}Of the funds appropriated to the Office of the Secretary, approximately \$1.3 million remains in unobligated balances. Within this total, \$0.9 million remains in the allocation to Departmental Administration and will be used for physical/operational security needs, and \$0.2 million remains in the allocation to the Office of the Chief Information Officer and will be used to complete the Business Resumption and Disaster Recovery Plans for critical information systems and complete the Project Matrix review that is to be conducted by the Department of Homeland Security. The remaining \$0.2 million remains in the allocation to the Homeland Security staff to provide economic analysis, leadership and coordination for Homeland Security activities.

*FDA Unobligated Funds: is planned to obligate by the end of the second quarter in FY 2005, with the majority of the unobligated funds used for Lab Security upgrades. The obligations for FDA have decreased by approximately \$29K since the end of fiscal year 2004. This is a result of a quarterly review of unliquidated obligations (over 18 months) to verify that the obligations are still valid. These de-obligations were mainly for Management and Professional Support services.

**CDC Unobligated Funds: will be used to upgrade CDC capacity fund and Evaluation Request for FY 2005; for State Local Capacity funds, and in security improvement; for ongoing NIOSH critical recovery work and for Environmental Hazard Controls. Display of funding for the Strategic National Stockpile has been moved back from DHS to HHS, where it was originally appropriated, as the Strategic National Stockpile was transferred from DHS to HHS in the Project BioShield Act of 2004, Public Law No: 108-276

***NIH Unobligated Funds: Approximately \$400k is for the BL-4 lab at RML and these funds are being held for the construction contingency, and may be used late this FY or during FY 2006. Approximately \$50k is for physical security improvements as part of the individual building security program.

****HRSA Unobligated Funds: Approximately \$1.6 million will be used for the Emergency System for Advance Registration of Volunteer Healthcare Personnel (ESAR-VHP) activities.

******OS Unobligated Funds: will be used for the Emergency Operation Contingency Fund, which are used to respond to emergency activations that are not authorized under the Stafford Act. The remaining funds will be used for technological upgrades to the Secretary's Command Center and continuing operation; along with completion of the HHS alternative COOP site in Raleigh, NC; and for use in the Stockpile fund.

**Of the \$40,800,000 transferred to the CT Fund, \$1,105,000 was made available to the United States Marshals Service, but could not be used for the purpose for which it was provided. Therefore, \$1,105,000 balance remains.

***The current unobligated balance, was appropriated to expand canine training capacity. Initial stages of a facility expansion were completed by a vendor, and ATF anticipates the vendor making claims against the government resulting from termination of the project.

****The FBI has \$13.044 million remaining for IT infrastructure from the 2002 Counterterrorism Supplemental. Funds will be applied toward case management solutions in FY 2005.

There is \$2.758 million remaining for expansion of overseas offices ("Legats") and enhancing information technology infrastructure for Legats. In coordination with the Department of State, FBI will be obligating the funds once Controlled Access Area space at the embassies is made available.

The FBI has \$4.294 million remaining for the computer intrusion program. The Congress has approved a spending plan for these funds, and they will be obligated by the end of FY 2005.

The remaining \$2.8 million is spread throughout the other initiatives. This includes \$0.686 remaining for Computer Analysis Response Team (CART), and \$1.396 for Combined Index DNA Systems. These remaining funds will be obligated by the end of FY 2005.
