The Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure recommends that the Judicial Conference:

1.	Approve the proposed amendments to Appellate Rules 1, 4, 5, 21, 24, 25, 26, 26.1, 27, 28, 31, 32, 36, 41, 44, and 45 and new Form 6 and transmit them to the Supreme Court for its consideration with the recommendation that they be adopted by the Court and transmitted to Congress in accordance with the law
2.	Approve the proposed amendments to Bankruptcy Rules 1004, 2004, 2014, 2015, 4004, 9014, and 9027, and new Rule 1004.1 and transmit them to the Supreme Court for its consideration with the recommendation that they be adopted by the Court and transmitted to Congress in accordance with the law. pp. 7-13
3.	Approve the proposed revisions to Official Bankruptcy Forms 1 and 15, and that the revisions take effect on December 1, 2001
4.	Approve the proposed amendments to Civil Rules 54, 58, and 81, and a new Rule 7.1, and Rule C of Supplemental Rules for Certain Admiralty and Maritime Claims and transmit these changes to the Supreme Court for its consideration with the recommendation that they be adopted by the Court and transmitted to Congress in accordance with the law
5.	Approve the proposed amendments to Criminal Rules 1 through 60 and transmit these changes to the Supreme Court for its consideration with the recommendation that they be adopted by the Court and transmitted to Congress in accordance with the law

Approve the separately proposed "substantive" amendments to Criminal Rules 5, 5.1, 10, 12.2, 26, 30, 35, and 43 and new Rule 12.4 and transmit these changes to the Supreme Court for its consideration with the recommendation that they be adopted by the Court and transmitted to Congress in accordance with the law pp. 24-35
