INCITS Awards to Moeller, Broome

John Moeller, past FGDC Staff Director, was presented with a 2007 Service Award from the InterNational Committee for Information Technology Standards (INCITS). Since his retirement from Federal service in 2002. John has taken on a leadership role in standardization activities. John was recommended for the INCITS Service Award on the basis of his leadership in organizing the 22nd plenary and meetings of ISO Technical Committee 211, Geographic information/Geomatics held in the United States in May 2006; his leadership in organizing a geospatial standards and interoperability workshop; and his efforts in developing and promoting the vision for Standards for the Americas, which advocates common international standards for geographic data sharing and interoperability in the Americans.

An INCITS Merit Award was given to the late Fred Broome. While Fred worked for the U.S. Census Bureau, he made major contributions to the FGDC, particularly to the Subcommittee for Cultural and Demographic Data, the Standards Working Group, and the Coordination Group. At the same time, Fred served as U.S. technical expert for several standards projects within the program of work for ISO Technical Committee 211, Geographic information/ Geomatics and as project editor for ISO 19114:2003, Geographic information — Quality Evaluation Procedures. Fred retired from the U.S. Census Bureau in 2003.

Following retirement, Fred provided immeasurable support in development of the Geographic Information Framework Data Content Standard, notably in design, development, testing, and implementation of a database and interface to register and track reviewers. He also developed and maintained the first version of the web site for INCITS Technical Committee L1, Geographic Information Systems.

INCITS is accredited by, and operates under rules approved by, the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), which are designed to ensure that voluntary standards are developed by consensus of directly and materially affected interests. INCITS Technical Committee L1 is the means by which the FGDC and its member agencies participate in voluntary consensus standards activities, consistent with OMB Circular A-119, at both the national and international levels. INCITS Technical Committee L1 serves as the U.S. technical advisory group (TAG) to ISO Technical Committee 211.

- The 45th Annual URISA Conference was held August 20-23, 2007 celebrating Sharing Technological Inspiration: Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow at the Hilton Washington in Washington, DC. The conference attracted nearly 6000 participants. Lynda Wayne was honored with the URISA Service Award noting her demonstrated faithful service to URISA and participation in its programs over recent years.

- The First International Circumpolar **Conference on Geospatial Sciences** and Applications was held in Yellowknife, NWT, Canada August 20-24. Sponsored by Natural Resources Canada, the conference hosted approximately 200 attendees from 20 nations to present on geospatial and remote sensing applications including focused discussion on the creation of a Virtual Arctic Spatial Data Infrastructure (ASDI) to support polar science and visualization. An accord between the polar nations is under development to rapidly prototype an SDI framework to publish polar data. The USGS has proposed to host the Second Circumpolar Conference in Alaska in 2009 -- timed to receive presentations on polar science and applications developed through the International Polar Year (IPY) effort. - The international Group on Earth **Observations (GEO) Architecture** and Data Committee meets in Washington, DC on September 12-13 to address ogress on over 30 formal tasks from the 2007-2009 work plan and to discuss ADC-related activities at the November GEO Plenary and Ministerial Summit in Cape Town, South Africa. In support of the Global Earth Observation System of Systems (GEOSS), six scenarios from the Architecture and Interoperability Pilot are recording video capture of applications of the GEOSS architecture, its registries, clearinghouses, and web portals, in support of a number of societal benefit areas. These GEO/GEOSS activities support the same interoperability standards and principles as webbased Spatial Data Infrastructures and bring additional geospatial data and services for use in place-based modeling and decision-support.
