Dear Ar. Chairman:

Your recent letter to Secretary Brown raises the question of additional access by the Select Committee on Assassinations to sensitive intelligence information. The pepartment has sought to be responsive to your initial general request by providing a briefing and follow-up letter that would meet the information needs of the Committee while safeguarding operational sources and methods. I have recently been advised that it may be possible to provide more focused assistance to the Committee, however, if the Department is given written questions on specific factual allegations or incidents under staff investigation. Bod intelligence sources tould be furnished as to whether Dod intelligence sources hold any information that would support or refute the versely of the allegation.

I believe that such an approach would assist the Committee in fulfilling its investigative responsibilities while allowing protection of sensitive defense intelligence techniques. I hope you will conclude that this proposal promises a satisfactory accommodation of our respective interests.
