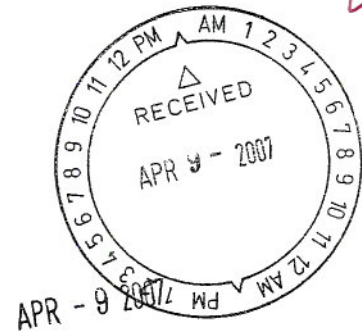

Sealaska Corporation is writing to express support for the 2009-2011 Cook Inlet LNG Export Extension Application filed jointly by ConocoPhillips Alaska Natural Gas Corporation and Marathon Oil Company. The applicants assert that there are sufficient supplies of natural gas and other energy sources to meet both the regional demand of Southcentral Alaska and the foreign export market during the two year period of the proposed export authorization.

The industrial facilities in Cook Inlet, including the LNG facility, support a number of good paying jobs, both directly and indirectly. The jobs contribute to the local economy and the facilities contribute to the State general fund through royalties and taxes.
