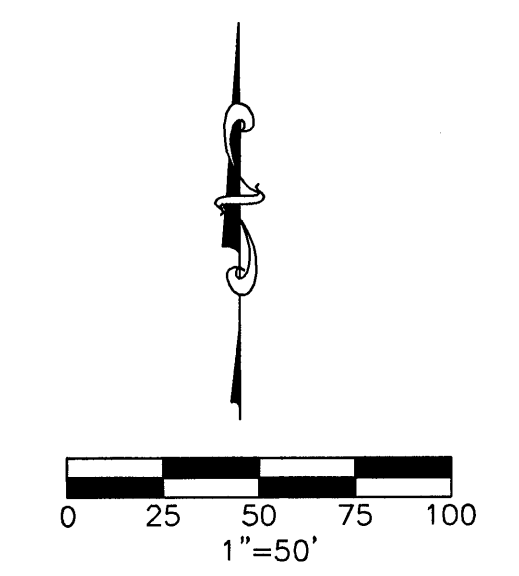

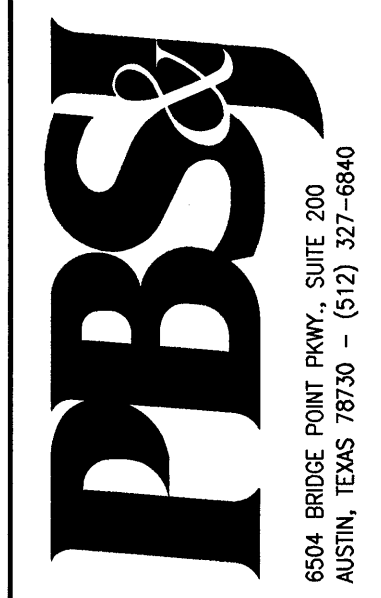

Dear Ms. Slick,

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), in response to the Presidentially declared Major Disaster Declaration, FEMA-1659-DR-NM, dated August 30, 2006, will be providing federal assistance authorized under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, P.L. 93-288, as amended. As a result of the recent flooding in Hatch, NM, a large number of the housing units in the city were severely damaged or destroyed. This created a housing shortage in the community and compounded the problems for the victims of the flooding. The State of New Mexico has requested FEMA assistance to provide emergency temporary housing for those individuals and families in Dona Ana County that experienced substantial damage to their personal residences. In accordance with the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) as amended August 5, 2004, FEMA has determined that this assistance constitutes an undertaking.

Due to the lack of available housing resources, FEMA is implementing the Direct Housing Program. This program provides housing assistance directly to individuals and families in the form of housing resources such as mobile homes. Based on factors such as the number of families affected, proximity to work, availability of transportation, and availability of water and utilities, FEMA plans to furnish, place and install approximately 50 to 75 manufactured (mobile) homes within the city of Hatch or in an adjacent community such as the previously consulted on site in Salem or in Rincon (see attachment # 1) at one or both of the following listed sites:

The manufactured homes will be transported, placed and connected to public utilities (i.e. electricity, water and sewer) to provide the needed housing. The proposed site work includes gravelling roads to the new trailer park, creation of gravel roads/driveways to each trailer, digging utilities to and from the trailer pads and moving trailers

to the actual location as well as installing stairs from the ground to each trailer. The trailers will be anchored to the ground as protection against strong winds and weatherproofing (trailer skirts) will also be installed.

Pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800, FEMA has notified (telephonically, by fax and by letter) (see attachments #2) the seven Native American Tribes with an interest in Dona Ana County, of the proposed project. The Fort Sill Apache Tribe of Oklahoma and the Comanche Nation of Oklahoma telephonically responded that they had no specific areas of concern. The White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation and Ysleta del Sur Pueblo responded electronically that they had no concerns unless unexpected discoveries were made (see attachments #3).


On October 11, 2006, an archeological survey was conducted on the two Rincon tracts of land. The survey was a Class III 100 percent pedestrian inspection of approximately 17 acres. Due to the fact that no cultural resource sites were discovered, (see attachment #4) the survey was considered a "negative findings" and will be reported through the use of the NMCRIS Investigations Abstract Form (NIAF).

Although no historic or cultural remains are likely to be encountered within the selected project area, in accordance with NHPA and New Mexico State law, should unanticipated historic or cultural materials be encountered during construction, all construction activities will be halted immediately within 60 feet of the remains until their ultimate disposition is determined in consultation with the New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officer and all interested parties.

After review of the sites and the "negative findings" result of the archeological survey, FEMA has determined that no historic properties will be affected by the proposed undertaking. I ask that you review the enclosed documentation, and provide your comments/concurrence with FEMA's finding "that no historic properties will be affected" by this emergency action. Dear Mr. Fairley:

I have reviewed the information provided in your letter of October 16, 2006, received in our office on the same date, for two possible temporary housing sites in Rincon, New Mexico, including FEMA's efforts to contact and request comments from seven Native American tribes with an interest in Dona Ana County and tribal responses, and the letter from Mr. Greenwald of Four Corners Research, Inc. summarizing the results of his archaeological survey.

I appreciate the thoroughness of your documentation of FEMA's tribal consultation efforts in this submittal and again found inclusion of the photographs very helpful. In the future, I request that a copy of the cultural resources survey report (either the NIAF or a positive survey report) be included in your submittal package. While I found the summary letter helpful it did not contain sufficient information for me to complete my review.


To expedite review of the project, I called Mr. Greenwald to discuss his findings and to request a copy of a completed NIAF. I also advised him that a records check of the New Mexico Cultural Resources Inventory System (NMCRIS) of the proposed project site and environs, based on the UTM coordinates provided in your letter, revealed the presence of a recorded historic site, LA 107960, a small, 25 by 15 m historic artifact scatter recorded in 1995 either in or near the project area. I emailed him a copy of the site form and requested that he review the form to determine whether the site is in the project area and, if so, whether prior blading had destroyed it. He has advised me that the site lies just outside the project area but is a likely source of some of the historic artifacts he did document during the survey (attachment 1).

Pending receipt of a copy of the NIAF report and attachments, the New Mexico State Historic Preservation Division conditionally concurs with FEMA's determination of No Historic Properties Affected for the two proposed temporary housing sites in Rincon.

Subject: FEMA project area/site

Jan, the site is just outside of the project area. The survey extended up to the road that forms the west site of the site and then across the north end. Some of the north end may extend into the current survey area, but that area has recently been disturbed by surface blading and construction of the large berm. There is a mobile home on the site; since it was outside the survey area and I didn't know there was a site nearby, I didn't look very closely at the that area and I don't recall if the entire area around the mobile home has been bladed. The aerial photo that was sent to me does not show the recent bladed disturbance or berms. If its what they sent you, it only shows Tract 2 (outlined in blue). Tract 1 consists of the 3 vacant lots west of Baker Street and north of Cactus.

Some of the IOs I recorded on Tract 1 are probably displaced from the site upsloe and to the east.

They are being asked if they have an area of concern regarding the proposed sites to place mobile homes for displaced individuals and families in Dona Ana County that were affected by the disaster. Also they are all told that a certified letter will follow our phone conversation regarding detailed information on the proposed sites. The most important thing we let them know that time is of the essence and to please contact FEMA immediately if there are any concerns. The following Tribes/Pueblos have been contacted:

10-03-06

Tribal Liaison contacted Mark Altaha, THPO for the **White Mountain Apache** regarding the proposed sites for placement of temporary mobile homes in Dona Ana County. He asked that the maps of the areas be faxed to him. The documents were faxed and he was told that a letter will be mailed regarding this soon.

Tribal Liaison contacted Alan Downer, THPO for the **Navajo Nation** regarding the proposed sites for placement of temporary mobile homes in Dona Ana County. He asked that the maps of the sites be faxed to him. The documents were faxed and he was informed that a letter regarding this situation will be mailed soon.

Tribal contacted Leland Michael Darrow from the **Fort Sill Apache Tribe of Oklahoma**. Michael stated that off hand he had no specific area of concern but would follow up and let us know if there were any issues.

Tribal contacted Ruth Toahty from the **Comanche Nation in Oklahoma**. Ruth stated that she did not know of any concerns and issues.

10-04-06

Tribal attempted to contact Rick Quezada from the **Ysleta del Sur Pueblo of Texas**. Three messages have been left, 2 on his voice mail and 1 with a tribal member stating the purpose for the call.

Tribal attempted to contact Robert Benavides from the **Pueblo of Isleta**. Two messages have been left stating the purpose for the call. Tribal will attempt to contact again today.

Tribal contacted Cody Browning from the **Mescalero Apache Tribe**. Holly Houghten the THPO is out of the office until Monday. Cody Browning, works in the same office as Holly, requested to have the letter faxed. Tribal contacted Environmental to have this information faxed to their office.

10-06-06

TL attempted to contact Rick Quezada from the **Ysleta del Sur Pueblo of Texas** today. I left a message informing him about the letter he will be receiving regarding areas of concern for the proposed sited for the mobile homes.

To date he has not returned any of my phone calls, 4 attempts have been made to contact him via phone.

Please let us know if we can assist you in any way regarding tribal matters.

10-09-06

Tribal Liaison spoke with Lt. Gov. Max Zuni, **Pueblo of Isleta**, today and during the conversation asked him if he had received the information sent regarding the proposed sites for placement of temporary housing in Dona Ana County. He stated that he had not received the information. I told him that it was sent by certified mail and I explained the purpose of the information being sent out and offered to fax him the maps of the locations. He accepted the offer to have the maps faxed. He stated that he will be back in touch after he looks at the maps.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), in response to the Presidentially declared Major Disaster Declaration, FEMA-1659-DR-NM, dated August 30, 2006, will be providing federal assistance authorized under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, P.L. 93-288, as amended. The State of New Mexico has requested FEMA assistance to provide emergency temporary housing for those individuals and families in Dona Ana County that experienced substantial damage to their personal residences.

FEMA through its Individual Assistance Program is proposing to furnish temporary housing assistance to the disaster impacted individuals and families by furnishing, placing and installing manufactured (mobile) homes within the community of Rincon, NM (see attached maps). The proposed site is located northerly of town near the old school, at latitude 32.6758, longitude -107.0659. It is anticipated that 50 to 75 mobile homes will be placed at this location.

The manufactured homes will be transported, placed and connected to public utilities (i.e. electricity, water and sewer) to provide the needed housing. The proposed site work includes creation of gravel roads within the park, gravelling roads to the temporary mobile home park, creating driveways to each unit, digging utilities to and from the manufactured home pads as well as installing stairs from the ground to each unit. The mobile homes will be anchored to the ground as protection against strong winds and weatherproofing (trailer skirts) will also be installed.

The proposed project is located northerly of town near the old school. This tract has been utilized by humans as an industrial park for years (see pictures). The areas adjacent to this site are open lands and a freeway to the north and the community of Rincon to south.

In accordance with Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act and based on review of the Federally listed threatened and endangered species, the designated and/or proposed critical habitat for Dona Ana County and the meeting of September 19, 2006, between David Wittum FEMA Environmental Liaison Officer, and Adam Zerrenner (Acting Field Supervisor), Joel Lusk (Biologist) and Marilyn Myers (Biologist), of the U. S. Fish and

Wildlife Service, NM Ecological Services Field Office, 2105 Osuna Road NE, Albuquerque, NM 87102, as well as the project being located on a previously disturbed parcel that does not contain suitable habitat, FEMA determines that the temporary, emergency mobile home project will have “no effect” on listed/proposed species and/or designated/proposed critical habitat. For the same reason, FEMA determines that the project will not have negative impacts related to the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act.

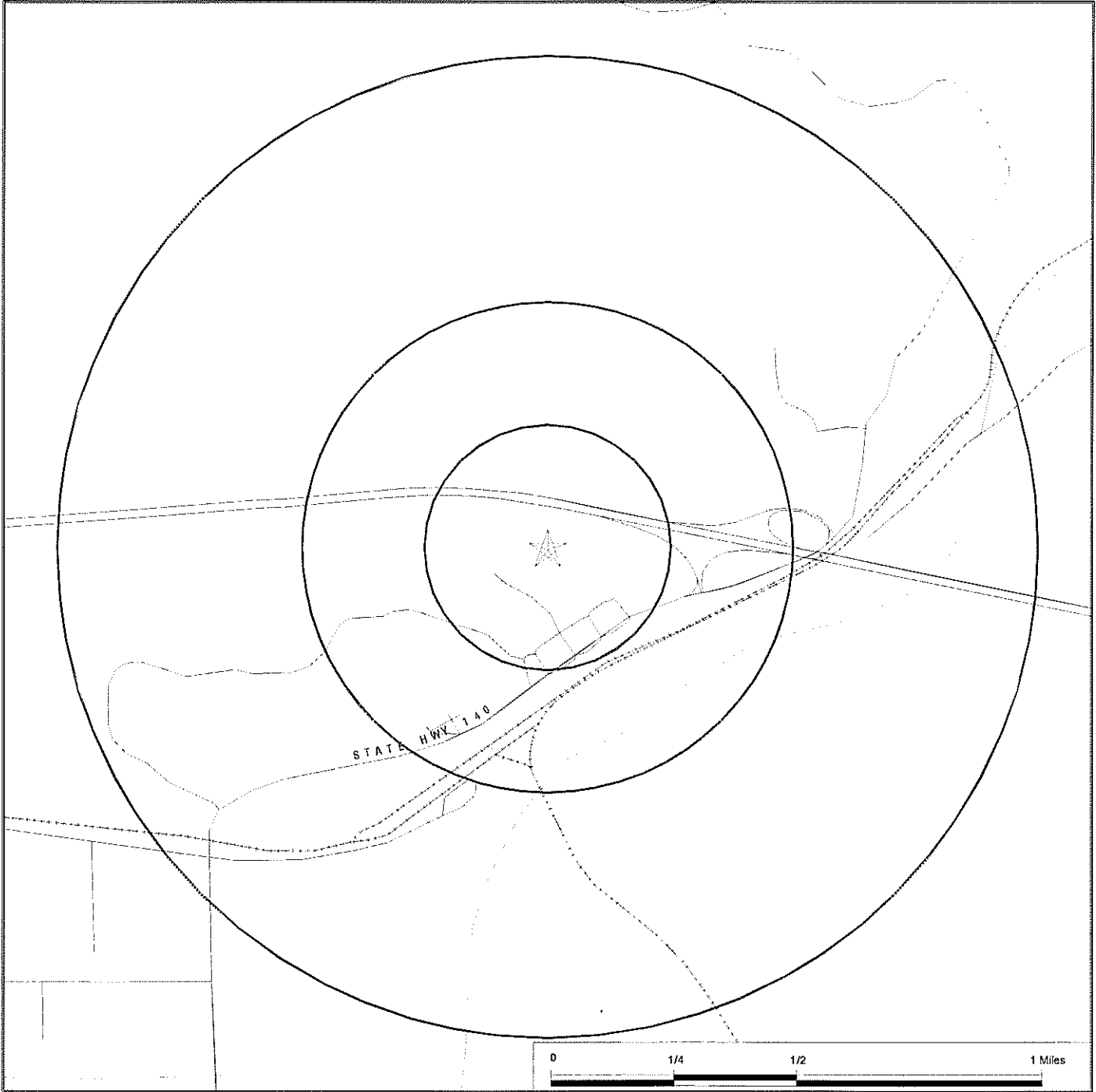

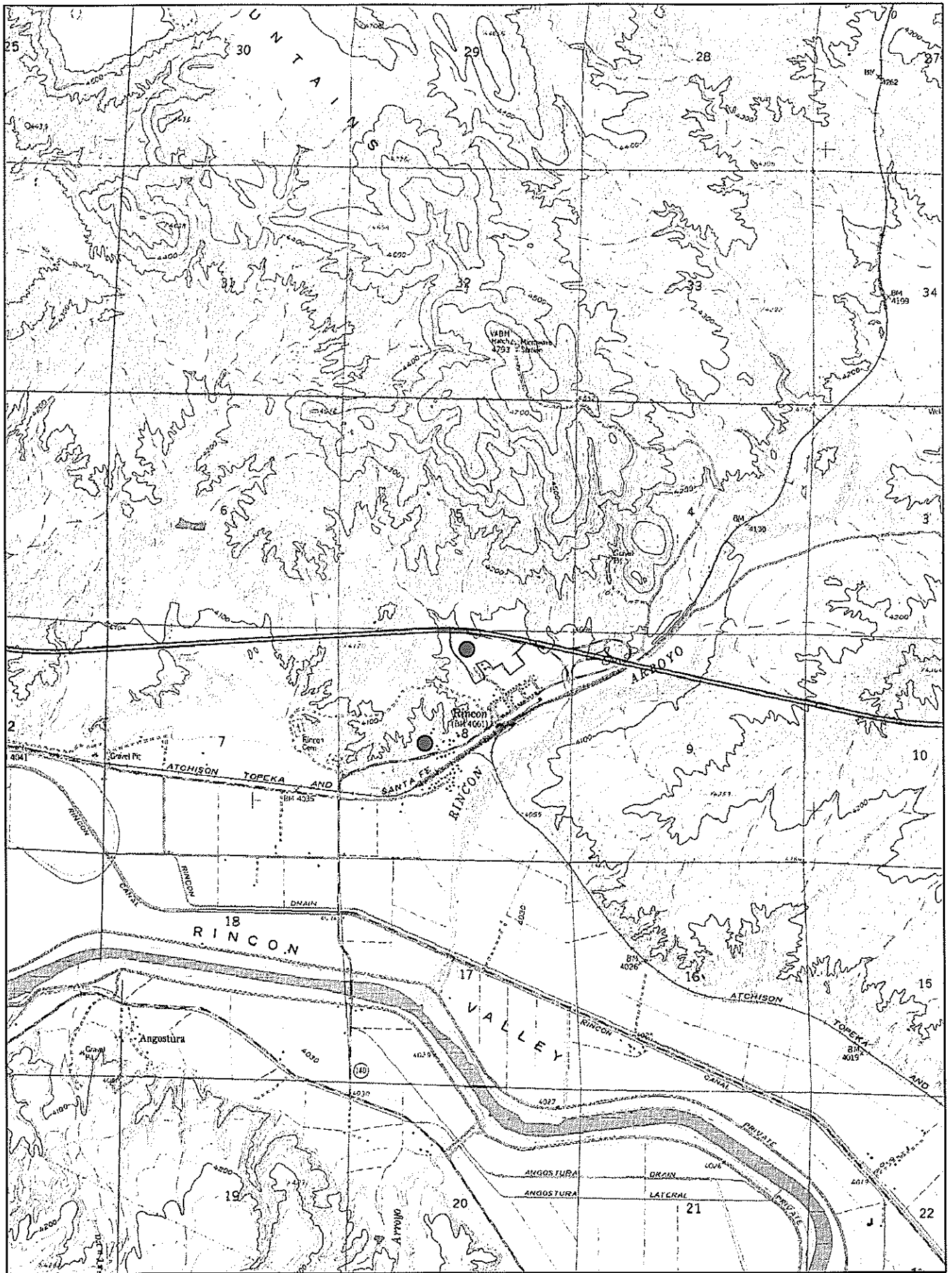

**LEGAL NOTICE
TEMPORARY EMERGENCY HOUSING
FOR DISASTER VICTIMS DISPLACED BY JULY FLOODING
FEMA-1659-DR-NM**

At the request of the State of New Mexico, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has been requested to develop temporary emergency housing in Doña Ana County, New Mexico. FEMA has tasked PBS&J to identify and develop temporary emergency housing sites in and around Hatch, New Mexico area for 50-100 modular homes to house victims of the flood.

The sites being considered in Rincon, NM are:

- The end of Baker and Harlan Streets Extensions (14 Acres)
- Rincon Resource Center (3 Acres)

The sites being considered in Hatch NM are:

- Placitas Property on Jefferson Street (8 acres)
- Hatch Industrial Park (47 acres)

Based upon the temporary emergency housing needs all or some or none of these identified sites may be developed.

In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) and implementing regulations of FEMA, a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) has been prepared assessing the potential impacts of the proposed emergency action on humans and the natural environment. A draft Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) has been prepared for the proposed emergency action.
