Reference is made to your request to temporarily impact jurisdictional wetlands located along Highway 98 in order to stabilize bluffs adjacent to the Highway. Specifically, the property is located at and adjacent to 30°39.81' North Latitude and 87°54.86' West Longitude along Highway 98 in Spanish Fort, Baldwin County, Alabama.

This letter verifies that your proposed bluff stabilization is already authorized by Nationwide Permit 33 in accordance with 33 CFR Part 330 of our regulations. NWP No. 33 and its associated Regional and General Conditions can be accessed at our website at www.sam.usace.army.mil/RD/reg/ or, at your request, a paper copy will be provided to you. Further authorization from this office is not required provided the scope of work is in accordance with your submitted plans, the Nationwide Permit conditions, and the following specific conditions. The impacted wetlands (ditch) are to be restored to pre-project elevation and will be allowed to re-vegetate with appropriate wetland plants. Should the area not recover to pre-project conditions within one year upon completion of the project, the applicant will be required to replant the area and take any measures necessary to ensure pre-project conditions are achieved. Erosion control measures will be utilized to insure adjacent waters of the United States are not impacted.

The statements contained herein do not convey any property rights, or any exclusive privileges, and do not authorize any injury to property or obviate the requirements to obtain other local, State or Federal assent required by law.

The District Engineer shall be notified promptly in writing at the commencement and completion of the work. The enclosed cards may be used for that purpose.

The enclosed Notice of Authorization must be posted at the site during construction of the permitted activity. If the scope of work or project location changes, you are urged to contact this office for a verification of this determination.

Please be advised that this jurisdictional determination reflects current policy and regulations. This Nationwide Permit authorization will expire March 19, 2007.

This letter is intended to provide additional project information and to request a re-evaluation of the Spanish Fort Bluff Stabilization Project referenced above. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers issued a No Permit Required for the proposed project by letter dated October 31, 2003. During an on-site survey of the project area on January 19, 2005, URS Group staff observed areas that unexpectedly exhibited typical wetland characteristics as described in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' 1987 Wetland Delineation Manual. Areas near the toe of the slope and on small benches along the bluff were noted as having hydrophytic vegetation, soils saturated within the upper twelve inches, and soils exhibiting low-chroma colors and reducing conditions. The hydrophytic vegetation observed included alder (Alnus serrulata), cane (Arundinaria gigantea), wax myrtle (Myrica heterophylla), and netted chain fern (Woodwardia areolata). Small seeps along the bluff appear to provide a source of saturations and are contributing to the stabilization problem. The stabilization problem would be addressed by the proposed project.

The Alabama Historical Commission concurs that the above referenced project should not adversely effect cultural resources listed on or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places provided that ALL ground disturbing activity occurs in the area that has experienced severe erosion damage. Because known archaeological resources lie adjacent, a cultural resource assessment should be performed by a professional archaeologist before any ground disturbing activity on the top of the bluff is undertaken. Reference is made to your letter requesting a jurisdictional determination on property located in the City of Spanish Fort. Specifically, the property is located within Baldwin County, Alabama.

An in-office review conducted on October 29, 2003, revealed that a Department of the Army permit pursuant to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act will not be required to restore and stabilize the Spanish Fort bluff. The property is a nonwetland/upland area based upon the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' 1987 Wetland Delineation Manual.

Attached below is the Archaeological Report our office prepared upon completion of our archaeological review of the proposed Pre-Disaster Mitigation Project in Spanish Fort and the resulting response from the Alabama Historical Commission (AHC). This letter is the first attachment.

Please note that the AHC agreed with the finding of the report and discussed two options:

- If the city selected the proposed design that impacted one of the two historic gunnery mounds on the site, it would have to conduct a Phase II testing. FEMA advised our office that it would not fund or reimburse this testing.
- If the city selected a design alternative that avoided the historic gunnery mounds, it would need to prepare a letter to our office indicating the selection of this option. We discussed the feasibility of a design alternative with the offices of the city's engineering firms, Volkert and Synergy, and they advised that such an option would cost approximately \$15,000.

Please indicate in a letter addressed to this office that copies both FEMA and the AHC, which alternative the city will select (addresses below). In all subsequent contracting the city enters into regarding this project, it must notify its contractors of any conditions required of the project resulting from AHC's and FEMA's review.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRIBUTION OF A PORTION OF THE MATCHING FUNDS FOR THE PRE-DISASTER MITIGATION GRANT TO STABILIZE THE BLUFF

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 117-2000, adopted and approved on March 20, 2000, authorized the Mayor to file an application for a bluff stabilization study; and

WHEREAS, the engineering study has been completed with an estimate of Three Million Two Hundred Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Seven Dollars (\$3,217,427.00) for the stabilization of the bluff; and

WHEREAS, the Baldwin County Emergency Management Agency is filing a Pre-Disaster Grant Application for the City of Spanish Fort "Bluff" restoration/stabilization; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 250-2003, adopted and approved on September 16, 2003, authorized the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) to be paid toward the matching funds required if the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant is awarded; and

WHEREAS, the environmental study has been completed with an estimate of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) to avoid and protect the gun emplacements on the bluff; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have determined that the protection of the Civil War Bunkers at the top of the Bluff is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Spanish Fort; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council desire to contribute Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) to protect the environment at the top of the Bluff.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPANISH FORT, ALABAMA, as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) to be paid for the protection of the gun emplacements on the bluff if the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant is awarded

Section 2. This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.

History:

This message has been forwarded.

Ms. Key,

I foresee no negative impacts on populations of any T/E species or migratory bird species.

There are two known bald eagle nests in the Mobile-Tensaw Delta north of the project area. These nests are approximately 5.5 and 6.5 miles from the site. Eagles enroute to feeding areas of the lower delta could occasionally be spotted.

Alabama redbelly turtle (*Pseudemys alabamensis*) is an endangered species found in the nearby delta waters. Females, of course, leave the water to lay their eggs. I do not recall ever encountering one along the roadway at the base of the bluff, but they are encountered with regularity on the Battleship Causeway.

Is any tree removal planned for the work to be done? There are some large trees at the site that could contain nests of one or more of our raptors that are common to the area. Any tree removal during nesting season should include a careful inspection of the tree(s) before removal.

As you are aware, the site is already greatly impacted from the deposition of stone and coverage of kudzu. Additional work at the site will make little impact on wildlife populations.

Mr. Clay,

I spoke to you earlier on the phone with regards to the Environmental Assessment I am working on for the City of Spanish Fort. The city has applied for a Pre-Disaster Mitigation grant from FEMA to help stabilize and control erosion coming from the Spanish Fort bluff.

The bluff overlooks U.S. Highway 98 and the neighborhood of Old Spanish Fort Estates along Patrician Drive resides on top of the bluff. The proposed stabilization of the Spanish Fort bluff consists of the construction of a series of four stabilization berms or benches. Each bench would be designed using internal geosynthetic reinforcing to achieve the required global stability factor of safety. An extensive subsurface drainage system to control hydrostatic pressures beneath and behind the stability benches would also be included. The project would eliminate virtually all of the erosion loss in the project area, which is the cause of the bluff subsidence.

Do you anticipate this project having any impacts upon migratory and/or T & E species in the area (any "takings" and/or modification of essential habitat)?

Is this a known nesting area for these birds?

How far are the two eagle nests located from the bluff?

Is this area located in a flyway? If so, which one?

In response to your email concerning the Spanish Fort bluffs, it has been determined that earthwork site #1 (as referred to in your email) would be impacted in the original design plan. In order to avoid direct impact to site #1, and its' buffer, some modification would be needed for the top-of-bluff ditch and drainage system in the vicinity of this gunnery mound. For this modification, our proposed ditch will need to end at approximately sta. 24+60. Additional drainage structures and the piping need for the avoidance modification connections are detailed below.

There is no direct impact on earthwork site #2, by the original planned construction.
