Dear Chairman Taylor,

I am writing to request your support for the Texas Water Resources Institute, the Civil War Battlefield Preservation Program, and the H.L. Hunley Submarine Project in the FY2007 Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill.

I request \$500,000 for the Texas Water Resources Institute to conduct a study on land management for flood control in northern Harris County, Harris County, where Houston is located, is experiencing significant development on the west side of the county. The Harris County Flood Control District has identified rural land management as a viable strategy to manage storm flow entering the suburban and urban parts of the county. This study will determine how the management of natural vegetation and agricultural lands can complement structural measures to detain storm water and reduce flooding in northern Harris County.

I strongly support President Bush's \$4 million budget request for the Civil War Battlefield Preservation Program. This request is an increase of \$1 million over what Congress appropriated for FY2006. The program provides funds to purchase land from willing sellers on sights of major engagements during the Civil War. I have personally visited some of these historic sites and I am committed to preserving them for future generations.

I also strongly support Congressman Henry Brown's \$1 million request for the H.L Hunley submarine. I have visited the Hunley and I believe that this request is both necessary and appropriate. The Hunley was the fist submarine to successfully sink a ship in military action and the historic value of this rare naval artifact is immeasurable not only to Charleston, but to our nation. The Hunley's historical and cultural importance should not be diminished.
