DOE Adds Additional Scoping Meeting and Extends Comment Period for the Supplement to Yucca Mountain Repository Environmental Impact Statement

LAS VEGAS, October 31, 2006 – The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) has scheduled a fourth public scoping meeting and has extended the public comment period to December 12, 2006, to help DOE determine the scope of the Supplemental Yucca Mountain EIS. Since the Yucca Mountain Final EIS was issued in 2002, DOE has continued to develop the repository design and associated operational plans. The Supplemental Yucca Mountain EIS will address current repository design and operational plans.

The meetings provide the public the opportunity to meet with project officials to discuss issues concerning new information to be included in the supplement, including the process for developing an environmental impact statement. This supplement will address the potential environmental impacts of the current repository design and operational plans.

The four public scoping meetings are scheduled as follows:

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The scoping meetings will be conducted in an open meeting format without a formal presentation by DOE. The public can attend the meetings at any time during their scheduled hours and will have the opportunity to submit written comments or offer comments verbally to a court reporter. The open format increases the public's opportunity to comment and have one-on-one discussions with DOE representatives involved in developing the Supplemental Yucca Mountain EIS. The comment period, which began on October 13, 2006, has been extended to 60-days in length and ends on December 12, 2006.
