Subject: Windows Experience

Bengt,

the recent events with GW (ISP sign up) and PB (screen border usage) are causing concern to Dell regarding how MS intends to police the Windows Experience aspect of DTOS agreements.

I spoke with Imler today and he is pretty PO'd (this is surprising to me as he is usually supportive). Much of Dell is pushing him to move away from Windows Experience compliance due to the actions and PB - Dell execs feel that being such an "honest citizen" does them no good. It leaves them a commercial disadvantage when others go out and gain a revenue stream from the edges of the market.

The noise level from other OEMs can only get louder.

My recommendation is that a letter (crafted by Kurt's group/Pete Peter) be sent to all DTOS OEMs underscoring MS commitment to Windows Experience (not just the ISP element). This letter should show our willingness to work cooperatively in developing better solutions that enhance the PC experience for end users. At the same time we need to get some PR from GW and PB that states that they have worked cooperatively with MS - this will encourage others to work with us rather than against us in the Windows Experience.
